<b>balance</b>	A weight that balances another weight. <i>A surplus on the capital account to make the account <b>balance</b>.</i>
<b><a href="#">breadth</a></b>	The capacity to understand a broad range of topics. <i>The bank reaches a maximum <b>breadth</b> of about 100 km.</i>
<b>class</b>	Arrange or order by classes or categories. <i>People who are socially disenfranchised by <b>class</b>.</i>
<b>course</b>	Part of a meal served at one time. <i>The government took a firm <b>course</b>.</i>
<b>echelon</b>	Arrange in an echelon formation. <i>The Task Force would take the left <b>echeloned</b> to be able to sweep in from the west.</i>
<b>epidermis</b>	The outer layer of the skin covering the exterior body surface of vertebrates.
<b>even</b>	Being level or straight or regular and without variation as e g in shape or texture or being in the same plane or at the same height as something else i e even with. <i>What is this whole thing <b>even</b> about.</i>
<b><a href="#">extent</a></b>	The point or degree to which something extends. <i>An enclosure ten acres in <b>extent</b>.</i>
<b>grade</b>	Arrange in or allocate to grades classify or sort. <i>A moderate <b>grade</b> of intelligence.</i>
<b>grading</b>	Changing the ground level to a smooth horizontal or gently sloping surface. <i>What he disliked about teaching was all the <b>grading</b> he had to do.</i>
<b>impermeable</b>	Preventing especially liquids to pass or diffuse through. <i><b>Impermeable</b> stone.</i>
<b>juridical</b>	Relating to judicial proceedings and the administration of the law. <i><b>Juridical</b> days.</i>

<b>level</b>	Become level or even. <i><b>Level</b> criticism or charges at somebody.</i>
<b>middlebrow</b>	A middlebrow person. <i><b>Middlebrow</b> fiction.</i>
<b>midway</b>	Having some of the characteristics of one thing and some of another. <i>He sensationally led the tournament at the <b>midway</b> point.</i>
<b>notch</b>	Secure or insert by means of notches. <i><b>Notch</b> the rope.</i>
<b>octane</b>	Any isomeric saturated hydrocarbon found in petroleum and used as a fuel and solvent.
<b>pentavalent</b>	Having a valence of five.
<b>phase</b>	Each of the electrical windings or connections of a polyphase machine or circuit. <i>About 70 of the reflections were <b>phased</b> by this method.</i>
<b>qualification</b>	The qualification stage of a sporting event. <i>The five year residency <b>qualification</b> for presidential candidates.</i>
<b>range</b>	Obtain the range of a target by adjustment after firing past it or short of it or by the use of radar or laser equipment. <i><b>Range</b> the animals in the prairie.</i>
<b>rank</b>	Take precedence or surpass others in rank. <i>An army officer of high <b>rank</b>.</i>
<b>scale</b>	Remove the scales from. <i>The skin may <b>scale</b> and peel away with itching stinging or burning sensations in the infected area.</i>
<b>spectrum</b>	The components of a sound or other phenomenon arranged according to such characteristics as frequency, charge, and energy. <i>Self help books are covering a broader and broader <b>spectrum</b>.</i>
<b>status</b>	A posting on a social networking website that indicates a user's current situation, state of mind, or opinion about something. <i>When I updated my <b>status</b> on Facebook yesterday I said I was seeking a sense of purpose.</i>
<b>step</b>	The sound of a step of someone walking. <i>The <b>steps</b> are in the outhouse.</i>
<b>straddle</b>	The option to buy or sell a given stock (or stock index or commodity future) at a given price before a given date; consists of an equal number of put and call options. <i>A sideways on stance such as a <b>straddle</b>.</i>
