- Large feline of forests in most of Asia having a tawny coat with black stripes; endangered.
- Used to refer to someone fierce, determined, or ambitious.
- A person with an insatiable appetite for something.
- A fierce or audacious person.

succeeder A person who accomplishes a desired aim or result.


The true **succeeder** of his house.
