| barb | The pointed part of barbed wire. <i>His barb hurt more than she cared to admit.</i> |
| buckle | Fasten with a buckle or buckles. <i>A weaker person might have buckled under the strain.</i> |
| compact | Make more compact by or as if by pressing. <i>A wide selection of films is available for your 35 mm compact.</i> |
| compressed | Reduced in volume by pressure. <i>Compressed air.</i> |
| constrict | Inhibit or restrict. <i>He felt his throat constrict.</i> |
| constricted | Inhibited; restricted. <i>A constricted blood vessel.</i> |
| corset | Dress with a corset. |
| cotton | Soft silky fibers from cotton plants in their raw state. <i>A cotton reel.</i> |
| crochet | Crocheted fabric or items. <i>She sat there crocheting all day.</i> |
| embroidery | Decorative needlework. <i>The bazaars stock a wide variety of embroidery.</i> |
| hoop | Bind or fasten with a hoop. <i>Spin the hoop around your waist or around your hips.</i> |
| interweave | Weave or become woven together. <i>The rugs are made by tightly interweaving the strands.</i> |
| knot | A particular method of making a knot. <i>You need to master two knots the clove hitch and the sheet bend.</i> |
| loosely | In a way that is not strict or exact. <i>You shouldn't speak loosely outside the group.</i> |

| needle | Prick or pierce with or as if with a needle. <i>He needled her with his sarcastic remarks.</i> |
| needlepoint | Embroider in needlepoint. |
| needlework | Work (such as sewing or embroidery) that is done with a needle. <i>Exhibits include Eastern needlework.</i> |
| net | The internet. <i>Rabbits can be netted all the year round.</i> |
| packed | Filled to capacity. <i>Packed snow.</i> |
| pressed | Compacted by ironing. <i>Immaculately pressed trousers.</i> |
| ribbon | Extend or move in a long narrow strip like a ribbon. <i>His medal ribbons were bright as a rainbow.</i> |
| sampler | An observation station that is set up to make sample observations of something. <i>A sampler of French poets.</i> |
| sew | Join fasten or repair something by making stitches with a needle and thread or a sewing machine. <i>She could sew the veil on properly in the morning.</i> |
| spangle | Decorate with spangles. <i>Beads spangled the skirt all the way to the hem.</i> |
| stitch | Make mend or join something with stitches. <i>Stitch a plain seam with right sides together.</i> |
| string | Provide with strings. <i>The D string broke.</i> |
| thimble | As much as a thimble will hold. |
| thread | A programming structure or process formed by linking a number of separate elements or subroutines especially each of the tasks executed concurrently in multithreading. <i>Thread the buttons on to a length of cotton.</i> |
| warp | In weaving arrange yarn so as to form the warp of a piece of cloth. <i>Crew and passengers helped warp the vessels through the shallow section.</i> |
