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• Associations of "Tight knit" (30 Words)

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barb	The pointed part of barbed wire. His <b>barb</b> hurt more than she cared to admit.
buckle	Fasten with a buckle or buckles. A weaker person might have <b>buckle</b> d under the strain.
<u>compact</u>	Make more compact by or as if by pressing. A wide selection of films is available for your 35 mm <b>compact</b> .
compressed	Reduced in volume by pressure. <i>Compressed</i> air.
<u>constrict</u>	Inhibit or restrict. <i>He felt his throat <b>constrict</b>.</i>
constricted	Inhibited; restricted. A <b>constricted</b> blood vessel.
corset	Dress with a corset.
cotton	Soft silky fibers from cotton plants in their raw state. A <b>cotton</b> reel.
crochet	Crocheted fabric or items. She sat there <b>crochet</b> ing all day.
embroidery	Decorative needlework. The bazaars stock a wide variety of <b>embroidery</b> .
hoop	Bind or fasten with a hoop. Spin the <b>hoop</b> around your waist or around your hips.
interweave	Weave or become woven together. The rugs are made by tightly interweaving the strands.
knot	A particular method of making a knot. You need to master two <b>knot</b> s the clove hitch and the sheet bend.
<u>loosely</u>	In a way that is not strict or exact. You shouldn t speak <b>loosely</b> outside the group.



needle	Prick or pierce with or as if with a needle. <i>He <b>needle</b>d her with his sarcastic remarks.</i>
needlepoint	Embroider in needlepoint.
needlework	Work (such as sewing or embroidery) that is done with a needle. <i>Exhibits include Eastern needlework</i> .
net	The internet. Rabbits can be <b>net</b> ted all the year round.
<u>packed</u>	Filled to capacity. <i>Packed</i> snow.
<u>pressed</u>	Compacted by ironing. Immaculately <b>pressed</b> trousers.
ribbon	Extend or move in a long narrow strip like a ribbon. His medal <b>ribbon</b> s were bright as a rainbow.
sampler	An observation station that is set up to make sample observations of something. A <b>sampler</b> of French poets.
sew	Join fasten or repair something by making stitches with a needle and thread or a sewing machine. She could <b>sew</b> the veil on properly in the morning.
spangle	Decorate with spangles. Beads <b>spangle</b> d the skirt all the way to the hem.
<u>stitch</u>	Make mend or join something with stitches. <i>Stitch</i> a plain seam with right sides together.
<u>string</u>	Provide with strings. <i>The D string</i> broke.
thimble	As much as a thimble will hold.
<u>thread</u>	A programming structure or process formed by linking a number of separate elements or subroutines especially each of the tasks executed concurrently in multithreading. <b>Thread</b> the buttons on to a length of cotton.
warp	In weaving arrange yarn so as to form the warp of a piece of cloth. Crew and passengers helped <b>warp</b> the vessels through the shallow section.
