| <b>april</b>                | The month following March and preceding May.   |
| <a href="#">biannual</a>    | Occurring twice a year.<br><i>The <b>biannual</b> meeting of the planning committee.</i>   |
| <a href="#">calendar</a>    | Enter something in a calendar or timetable.<br><i>I have you on my <b>calendar</b> for next Monday.</i>  |
| <b>centenary</b>            | The 100th anniversary (or the celebration of it).<br><i>The <b>centenary</b> year of the artist s birth.</i>   |
| <a href="#">concomitant</a> | An event or situation that happens at the same time as or in connection with another.<br><i>He sought promotion without the necessary <b>concomitant</b> of hard work.</i> |
| <a href="#">daily</a>       | Every day.<br><i>The museum is open <b>daily</b>.</i>  |
| <b>day</b>                  | The part of a day when it is light the time between sunrise and sunset.<br><i>We ll leave the <b>day</b> after tomorrow.</i>   |
| <a href="#">ensuing</a>     | Occurring afterwards or as a result.<br><i>She lost track of one of her children during the <b>ensuing</b> chaos.</i>  |
| <b>hour</b>                 | The distance travelled in one hour.<br><i>Rates of pay were low starting at 3 20 an <b>hour</b>.</i>   |
| <a href="#">late</a>        | Later than usual or than expected.<br><i><b>Later</b> medical science could have saved the child.</i>  |

| <b>monthly</b>           | A magazine that is published once a month.<br><i>An Anglo American <b>monthly</b> whose appeal was always international.</i>                  |
| <b>o'clock</b>           | According to the clock.   |
| <b>oft</b>               | Many times at short intervals.<br><i>An <b>oft</b> quoted tenet.</i>  |
| <b>period</b>            | A set of elements occupying a horizontal row in the periodic table.<br><i>He interviewed the teachers when they had a free <b>period</b>.</i> |
| <b><u>periodic</u></b>   | Relating to the periodic table of the elements.<br><i>The <b>periodic</b> visits she made to her father.</i>                                  |
| <b>periodically</b>      | From time to time; occasionally.<br><i>The students received help from a friend only <b>periodically</b>.</i>                                 |
| <b>periodicity</b>       | The quality or character of being periodic; the tendency to recur at intervals.<br><i>The <b>periodicity</b> of the sunspot cycle.</i>        |
| <b>recent</b>            | The Holocene epoch.<br><i>A <b>recent</b> addition to the house.</i>  |
| <b>regular</b>           | A soldier in the regular army.<br><i><b>Regular</b> bus departures.</i>   |
| <b><u>regularly</u></b>  | With a constant or definite pattern, especially with the same space between individual items.<br><i>A <b>regularly</b> updated news page.</i> |
| <b>semiannual</b>        | Occurring or payable twice each year.   |
| <b><u>shortly</u></b>    | Abruptly, sharply, or curtly.<br><i>To put it <b>shortly</b>.</i>   |
| <b><u>thereafter</u></b> | After that time.<br><i>It was agreed that the meeting be held annually <b>thereafter</b>.</i>   |
| <b>timing</b>            | The choice, judgement, or control of when something should be done.<br><i>One of the secrets of cricket is good <b>timing</b>.</i>            |
| <b><u>tomorrow</u></b>   | The day after today.<br><i><b>Tomorrow</b> s Grand Prix in Brazil.</i>  |
| <b><u>weekly</u></b>     | A newspaper or periodical issued every week.<br><i>There was a <b>weekly</b> dance on Wednesdays.</i>   |
| <b><u>year</u></b>       | A year regarded in terms of the quality of something produced.<br><i>She was in my <b>year</b> at Hoehandle High.</i>                         |
