Timely as an Adjective

Definitions of "Timely" as an adjective

According to the [Oxford Dictionary of English](#), “timely” as an adjective can have the following definitions:

- *Done or occurring at a favourable or useful time; opportune.*
- *Before a time limit expires.*
- *Done or happening at the appropriate or proper time.*
- *Done or occurring sufficiently early; prompt.*

appropriate	Suitable for a particular person or place or condition etc. <i>It seems that an apology is appropriate.</i>
apt	Having a tendency to do something. <i>An apt reply.</i>
convenient	Large and roomy convenient is archaic in this sense. <i>I phoned your office to confirm that this date is convenient.</i>
expedient	Serving to promote your interest. <i>Holding a public enquiry into the scheme was not expedient.</i>
felicitous	Exhibiting an agreeably appropriate manner or style. <i>A felicitous life.</i>
fitting	Being precisely fitting and right. <i>It was fitting that his last innings for Middlesex should bring him his highest first class score.</i>

- opportune** Done or occurring at a favourable time; well timed.
*An **opportune** time to receive guests.*
- prompt** Ready and willing or quick to act.
*A **prompt** reply.*
- punctual** Acting or arriving or performed exactly at the time appointed.
***Punctual** payment.*
- seasonable** Done or happening at the appropriate or proper time.
*A **seasonable** time for discussion.*
- suitable** Right or appropriate for a particular person, purpose, or situation.
*A tractor **suitable** or fit for heavy duty.*
- well timed** Wise or advantageous and hence advisable.
- well-timed** Done or happening at the appropriate or proper time.



Usage Examples of "Timely" as an adjective

- *A timely warning.*
- *With timely treatment the patient has a good chance of recovery.*
- *Timely diagnosis and subsequent early administration will be imperative.*
- *The timely filing of his income tax return.*

correct	Make right or correct. <i>Correct the alignment of the front wheels.</i>
corrective	Tending or intended to correct or counteract or restore to a normal condition. <i>Corrective measures.</i>
equitable	Valid in equity as distinct from law. <i>Equitable treatment of all citizens.</i>
fitting	The action of fitting something. <i>Loose fitting trousers.</i>
germane	Relevant and appropriate. <i>He asks questions that are germane and central to the issue.</i>
incidentally	Introducing a different topic; in point of fact. <i>Incidentally it was many months before the whole truth was discovered.</i>
just	Of an opinion or appraisal well founded justifiable. <i>I only just caught the bus.</i>
legitimate	Make an illegitimate child legitimate declare the legitimacy of someone. <i>A legitimate government.</i>
licit	Not forbidden; lawful. <i>Usage patterns differ between licit and illicit drugs.</i>
opportune	Suitable or at a time that is suitable or advantageous especially for a particular purpose. <i>An opportune arrival.</i>
pertinence	Relevance by virtue of being applicable to the matter at hand.
pertinent	Having precise or logical relevance to the matter at hand. <i>Practitioners must consider all factors pertinent to a situation.</i>
proper	Appropriate for a condition or purpose or occasion or a person's character, needs. <i>Proper manners.</i>

properly

With reason or justice.
*A **properly** drafted agreement.*

punctual

Acting or arriving or performed exactly at the time appointed.
*She expected guests to be **punctual** at meals.*

relevance

The relation of something to the matter at hand.
*The quantity quality and **relevance** of links count towards your rating.*

relevant

Appropriate to the current time, period, or circumstances; of contemporary interest.
*The scientist corresponds with colleagues in order to learn about matters **relevant** to her own research.*

right

A road or entrance on the right.
*The **right** answer.*

rightness

The quality or state of being best or most appropriate for a particular situation.
*They argue for the moral **rightness** of overthrowing the leader by force.*

seasonable

In keeping with the season.
*The **seasonable** temperatures.*

seemly

According with custom or propriety.
***Seemly** behavior.*
