appropriate	Suitable for a particular person or place or condition etc. It seems that an apology is <b>appropriate</b> .
<u>apt</u>	Having a tendency to do something. An <b>apt</b> reply.
<u>convenient</u>	Large and roomy convenient is archaic in this sense. I phoned your office to confirm that this date is <b>convenient</b> .
expedient	Serving to promote your interest. Holding a public enquiry into the scheme was not <b>expedient</b> .
felicitous	Exhibiting an agreeably appropriate manner or style. A <b>felicitous</b> life.
fitting	Being precisely fitting and right. It was <b>fitting</b> that his last innings for Middlesex should bring him his highest first class score.



<u>opportune</u>	Done or occurring at a favourable time; well timed. An <b>opportune</b> time to receive guests.
prompt	Ready and willing or quick to act. A <b>prompt</b> reply.
<u>punctual</u>	Acting or arriving or performed exactly at the time appointed. <i>Punctual payment.</i>
seasonable	Done or happening at the appropriate or proper time. A <b>seasonable</b> time for discussion.
<u>suitable</u>	Right or appropriate for a particular person, purpose, or situation. <i>A tractor</i> <b>suitable</b> or fit for heavy duty.
well timed	Wise or advantageous and hence advisable.
well-timed	Done or happening at the appropriate or proper time.





#### Usage Examples of "Timely" as an adjective

- A timely warning.
- With timely treatment the patient has a good chance of recovery.
- *Timely diagnosis and subsequent early administration will be imperative.*
- The timely filing of his income tax return.

<u>chronicle</u>	A record or narrative description of past events. A vast <b>chronicle</b> of Spanish history.
chronological	Relating to or arranged according to temporal order. The diary provided a <b>chronological</b> framework for the events.
correct	Make right or correct. <b>Correct</b> the alignment of the front wheels.
<u>corrective</u>	Tending or intended to correct or counteract or restore to a normal condition. <i>Corrective measures.</i>
equitable	Valid in equity as distinct from law. <b>Equitable</b> treatment of all citizens.
fitting	The action of fitting something. Loose <b>fitting</b> trousers.
germane	Relevant and appropriate. <i>He asks questions that are <b>germane</b> and central to the issue.</i>
incidentally	Introducing a different topic; in point of fact. <i>Incidentally</i> it was many months before the whole truth was discovered.
<u>just</u>	Of an opinion or appraisal well founded justifiable. I only <b>just</b> caught the bus.
legitimate	Make an illegitimate child legitimate declare the legitimacy of someone. A <b>legitimate</b> government.
licit	Not forbidden; lawful. Usage patterns differ between <b>licit</b> and il <b>licit</b> drugs.
<u>opportune</u>	Suitable or at a time that is suitable or advantageous especially for a particular purpose. An <b>opportune</b> arrival.
pertinence	Relevance by virtue of being applicable to the matter at hand.
pertinent	Having precise or logical relevance to the matter at hand. <i>Practitioners must consider all factors</i> <b>pertinent</b> to a situation.
proper	Appropriate for a condition or purpose or occasion or a person's character, needs. <b>Proper</b> manners.



<u>properly</u>	With reason or justice. A <b>properly</b> drafted agreement.
<u>punctual</u>	Acting or arriving or performed exactly at the time appointed. She expected guests to be <b>punctual</b> at meals.
<u>relevance</u>	The relation of something to the matter at hand. The quantity quality and <b>relevance</b> of links count towards your rating.
<u>relevant</u>	Appropriate to the current time, period, or circumstances; of contemporary interest. <i>The scientist corresponds with colleagues in order to learn about</i> <i>matters</i> <b>relevant</b> <i>to her own research.</i>
right	A road or entrance on the right. <i>The <b>right</b> answer.</i>
rightness	The quality or state of being best or most appropriate for a particular situation. They argue for the moral <b>rightness</b> of overthrowing the leader by force.
seasonable	In keeping with the season. The <b>seasonable</b> temperatures.
seemly	According with custom or propriety. <i>Seemly</i> behavior.
