## **Times as a Noun**

### **Definitions of "Times" as a noun**

According to the [Oxford Dictionary of English](#), “times” as a noun can have the following definitions:

- *An arithmetic operation that is the inverse of division; the product of two numbers is computed.*
- *A more or less definite period of time now or previously present.*



## Synonyms of "Times" as a noun (1 Word)

**multiplication** A multiplicative increase.  
*Repeated copying leads to a **multiplication** of errors.*

<b>algebra</b>	A system of algebra based on given axioms. <i>Courses in <b>algebra</b> geometry and Newtonian physics.</i>
<b>billion</b>	The number that is represented as a one followed by 9 zeros.
<b>calculable</b>	Able to be measured or assessed. <i>The conversion of mass into energy affects stars in a <b>calculable</b> fashion.</i>
<b>double</b>	A double measure of spirits. <i>36 is the <b>double</b> of 18.</i>
<b>doubly</b>	In a twofold manner. <i>We re going to have to work <b>doubly</b> hard.</i>
<b>dual</b>	Convert a road into a dual carriageway. <i>Though there are no plans to <b>dual</b> the road a public consultation on the A64 is set to start before the end of the year.</i>
<b>eight</b>	One of four playing cards in a deck with eight pips on the face.

<b>exponential</b>	Of or involving exponents. <i>The social security budget was rising at an <b>exponential</b> rate.</i>
<b>five</b>	A playing card or a domino or a die whose upward face shows five pips.
<b>four</b>	A playing card or domino or die whose upward face shows four pips.
<b>hundred</b>	A subdivision of a county or shire, having its own court. <i>Wantage <b>Hundred</b>.</i>
<b>math</b>	Mathematics. <i>She teaches <b>math</b> and science.</i>
<b>mathematics</b>	The abstract science of number quantity and space either as abstract concepts pure mathematics or as applied to other disciplines such as physics and engineering applied mathematics. <i>A taste for <b>mathematics</b>.</i>
<b>million</b>	The number that is represented as a one followed by 6 zeros. <i>There were <b>millions</b> of flies.</i>
<b>multiplication</b>	A multiplicative increase. <i>Repeated copying leads to a <b>multiplication</b> of errors.</i>
<a href="#"><u>multiply</u></a>	Obtain from (a number) another which contains the first number a specified number of times. <i>Listeria and other bacteria were able to <b>multiply</b> in very low temperatures.</i>
<b>nine</b>	One of four playing cards in a deck with nine pips on the face.
<a href="#"><u>number</u></a>	Give numbers to. <i>You should <b>number</b> the pages of the thesis.</i>
<b>numeral</b>	A figure, symbol, or group of figures or symbols denoting a number. <i>He learned to write the <b>numerals</b> before he went to school.</i>
<b>plural</b>	The plural number. <i>The first person <b>plural</b>.</i>
<b>seven</b>	One of four playing cards in a deck with seven pips on the face.
<b>seventy</b>	Being ten more than sixty.
<b>six</b>	Denoting a quantity consisting of six items or units.
<b>ten</b>	One of four playing cards in a deck with ten pips on the face.
<a href="#"><u>tenfold</u></a>	By ten times; to ten times the number or amount. <i>Production increased <b>tenfold</b>.</i>
<b>thirty</b>	Being ten more than twenty.
<b>thousand</b>	The cardinal number that is the product of 10 and 100.
<a href="#"><u>three</u></a>	One of four playing cards in a deck having three pips.

**twelve**

Denoting a quantity consisting of 12 items or units.
