- *Formerly a person (traditionally a Gypsy) who traveled from place to place mending pots and kettles and other metal utensils as a way to earn a living.*
- *(especially in former times) a person who makes a living by travelling from place to place mending pans and other metal utensils.*
- *An act of attempting to repair something.*
- *A person who enjoys fixing and experimenting with machines and their parts.*

chub mackerel	Any of various fishes of the family Scombridae.
imp	(folklore) fairies that are somewhat mischievous. <i>A cheeky young imp.</i>
minx	An impudent, cunning, or boldly flirtatious girl or young woman. <i>You saucy little minx.</i>
mischief-maker	Someone who deliberately stirs up trouble.
monkey	A person who is dominated or controlled by another with reference to the monkey traditionally kept by an organ grinder. <i>Where have you been you little monkey.</i>
prankster	Someone who plays practical jokes on others.
puck	An input device resembling a mouse, dragged across a mat which senses its position to move the cursor on the screen.
rascal	A mischievous or cheeky person, especially a child or man (typically used in an affectionate way). <i>You are such a rascal.</i>
rogue	A person whose behaviour one disapproves of but who is nonetheless likeable or attractive. <i>Genzo you old rogue.</i>
scomber japonicus	Small mackerel found nearly worldwide.
<u>tinkerer</u>	An unskilled person who tries to fix or mend.

- *Work as a tinker or tinkerer.*

dally with	Consider not very seriously.
fiddle	Play the violin or fiddle. <i>Lena fiddled with her cup.</i>
fiddle with	Avoid (one's assigned duties).
fool about with	Spend frivolously and unwisely.
fool around with	Spend frivolously and unwisely.
mess around	Make a mess of or create disorder in.
monkey	Do random, unplanned work or activities or spend time idly. <i>Don't monkey with that lock.</i>
monkey around	Do random, unplanned work or activities or spend time idly.

play about with	Act or have an effect in a specified way or with a specific effect or outcome.
play around with	Be received or accepted or interpreted in a specific way.
play with	Act or have an effect in a specified way or with a specific effect or outcome.
potter	Move around aimlessly. <i>I m quite happy just to potter about by myself here.</i>
potter about with	Move around aimlessly.
putter	Work lightly.
toy with	Behave carelessly or indifferently.
trifle with	Consider not very seriously.
try to improve	Put on a garment in order to see whether it fits and looks nice.
try to mend	Examine or hear (evidence or a case) by judicial process.
work amateurishly on	Exert oneself by doing mental or physical work for a purpose or out of necessity.

amenity	The pleasantness or attractiveness of a place. <i>Developments which would clash with amenity.</i>
apparatus	The complex structure of a particular organization or system. <i>The breathing apparatus.</i>
appliance	A device or piece of equipment designed to perform a specific task. <i>The appliance of science could increase crop yields.</i>
<u>archer</u>	A person who is expert in the use of a bow and arrow.
butcher	A person who slaughters and cuts up animals for food. <i>The film was butchered by the studio that released it.</i>

contraption	A machine or device that appears strange or unnecessarily complicated, and often badly made or unsafe. <i>Repairing stereos and making contraptions out of spare electronic bits.</i>
contrivance	An artificial or unnatural or obviously contrived arrangement of details or parts etc. <i>The often tiresome contrivances of historical fiction.</i>
convenience	A device or control that is very useful for a particular job. <i>The large council car park next to the public conveniences.</i>
device	An emblematic or heraldic design. <i>The device is small enough to wear on your wrist.</i>
drum	Play on a drum or drums. <i>He channelled his energies into drumming with local groups.</i>
<u>electronic</u>	Of or relating to electronics concerned with or using devices that operate on principles governing the behavior of electrons. <i>An electronic calculator.</i>
electronics	The branch of physics that deals with the emission and effects of electrons and with the use of electronic devices. <i>Electronics engineers.</i>
equipment	The process of supplying someone or something with necessary equipment. <i>A gym with all the latest equipment.</i>
expedience	Taking advantage of opportunities without regard for the consequences for others.
expediency	The quality of being suited to the end in view. <i>An act of political expediency.</i>
fiddle	Play the violin or fiddle. <i>He fiddled with the blind trying to prevent the sun from shining in her eyes.</i>
gadget	A device or control that is very useful for a particular job. <i>A variety of kitchen gadgets.</i>
gizmo	A device or control that is very useful for a particular job. <i>There may be some great new gizmo around the corner that you will want to use.</i>
<u>instrument</u>	Equip with instruments for measuring recording or controlling. <i>A new instrument for measuring ozone levels.</i>
keyboard	Enter data by means of a keyboard. <i>Keyboarding is an important job skill.</i>

<u>mechanism</u>	(philosophy) the philosophical theory that all phenomena can be explained in terms of physical or biological causes. <i>The mechanism of infection.</i>
microprocessor	An integrated circuit that contains all the functions of a central processing unit of a computer. <i>A disk drive contains a microprocessor to handle the internal functions of the drive.</i>
play	The act of playing for stakes in the hope of winning including the payment of a price for a chance to win a prize. <i>They made a futile play for power.</i>
potter	A craftsman who shapes pottery on a potter s wheel and bakes them it a kiln. <i>I m quite happy just to potter about by myself here.</i>
<u>rendition</u>	(especially in the US) the practice of sending a foreign criminal or terrorist suspect covertly to be interrogated in a country with less rigorous regulations for the humane treatment of prisoners. <i>They heard a live rendition of three pieces by Schubert.</i>
scraper	A tool or device used for scraping, especially for removing dirt, paint, or other unwanted matter from a surface. <i>Residues should be removed with sharp scrapers.</i>
synthesizer	An intellectual who synthesizes or uses synthetic methods.
tool	Equip or be equipped with tools for industrial production. <i>The beautiful Estella is Miss Havisham s tool.</i>
<u>toy</u>	Move or handle (an object) absent-mindedly or nervously. <i>Alan toyed with his glasses.</i>
widget	An application, or a component of an interface, that enables a user to perform a function or access a service.
