- *An artificial dye for colouring the hair.*
- *A shade or variety of a colour.*
- *A dye for coloring the hair.*
- *A just detectable amount.*
- *A set of parallel engraved lines to give uniform shading.*
- *A quality of a given color that differs slightly from another color.*
- *An area of faint even colour printed as a half-tone, used for highlighting overprinted text.*
- *An application of hair dye.*



## Synonyms of "Tint" as a noun (18 Words)

- blush** A pink or pale red tinge.  
*He had brought a faint **blush** to her cheeks.*
- cast** A mould used to make an object by casting.  
*He gave one thousand pounds for a **cast** of hawks.*
- colour** The use of all colours not only black and white in photography or television.  
*All **colours** and nationalities.*
- colourant** A dye, pigment, or other substance that colours something.  
*A range of natural hair **colourants**.*
- colouring** A race with skin pigmentation different from the white race (especially Blacks).  
*The salon concentrates purely on **colouring**.*
- dye** A natural or synthetic substance used to add a colour to or change the colour of something.  
*Blonde hair **dye**.*

<b><u>flush</u></b>	Denoting a type of toilet that has a flushing device. <i>He heard the <b>flush</b> of a toilet.</i>
<b>hair coloring</b>	A covering for the body (or parts of it) consisting of a dense growth of threadlike structures (as on the human head); helps to prevent heat loss.
<b>hair dye</b>	Any of the cylindrical filaments characteristically growing from the epidermis of a mammal.
<b>hint</b>	An indication of potential opportunity. <i>Randall smiled with a <b>hint</b> of mockery.</i>
<b><u>hue</u></b>	A colour or shade. <i>Men of all political <b>hues</b> submerged their feuds.</i>
<b><u>shade</u></b>	An eyeshade. <i>It is much cooler in the <b>shade</b>.</i>
<b>suggestion</b>	An idea or belief accepted by a person as a result of suggestion. <i>There was a <b>suggestion</b> of a smile on his lips.</i>
<b>tincture</b>	A substance that colors or dyes. <i>A <b>tincture</b> of condescension.</i>
<b>tinge</b>	A trace of a colour. <i>There was a faint pink <b>tinge</b> to the sky.</i>
<b>tone</b>	A steady sound without overtones. <i>The muffled <b>tones</b> of the broken bell summoned them to meet.</i>
<b><u>trace</u></b>	A physical change in the brain presumed to be caused by a process of learning or memory. <i>Just a <b>trace</b> of a smile.</i>
<b><u>wash</u></b>	An act of washing something or an instance of being washed. <i>She hung out her Tuesday <b>wash</b>.</i>



## Usage Examples of "Tint" as a noun

- *A tint of glamour.*
- *Peering into the mirror to see if any white hair showed after her last tint.*
- *The sky was taking on an apricot tint.*



## Tint as a Verb

### Definitions of "Tint" as a verb

According to the [Oxford Dictionary of English](#), "tint" as a verb can have the following definitions:

- *Color lightly.*
- *Colour (something) slightly; tinge.*
- *Dye (someone's hair) with a tint.*



### Synonyms of "Tint" as a verb (3 Words)

**tinct** Color lightly.

**tinge** Permeate or imbue slightly with a feeling or quality.  
*The leaves were **tinged** red in November.*

**touch** Used to indicate that something is avoided or rejected.  
*The voice was **touched** by hysteria.*



## Usage Examples of "Tint" as a verb

- *They spent hours having their hair tinted and set.*
- *Her skin was tinted with delicate colour.*



## Associations of "Tint" (30 Words)

<b><u>blur</u></b>	Make unclear indistinct or blurred. <i>The pale <b>blur</b> of her face.</i>
<b><u>brown</u></b>	Make brown in color. <i>I interviewed 60 mostly black and <b>brown</b> leaders around our nation.</i>
<b>color</b>	Any material used for its color. <i>His political ideas <b>color</b> his lectures.</i>
<b>colored</b>	Having color or a certain color; sometimes used in combination. <i>Amber <b>colored</b> heads of grain.</i>
<b>complexion</b>	Texture and appearance of the skin of the face. <i>The setting sun <b>complexioned</b> the hills.</i>



<b>discolor</b>	Change color, often in an undesired manner. <i>The painting <b>discolored</b>.</i>
<b>dye</b>	Take colour well or badly during the dyeing process. <i>Please <b>dye</b> these shoes.</i>
<b>faint</b>	(of a hope or chance) possible but unlikely; slight. <i>She sent him a <b>faint</b> answering smile.</i>
<b>hue</b>	Character or aspect. <i>Men of all political <b>hues</b> submerged their feuds.</i>
<b>iris</b>	Of an aperture typically that of a lens open or close in the manner of an iris or iris diaphragm.
<b>motley</b>	Make motley color with different colors. <i>A jester dressed in <b>motley</b>.</i>
<b>mottled</b>	Marked with spots or smears of colour. <i>A bird with <b>mottled</b> brown plumage.</i>
<b>painted</b>	Having makeup applied. <i>Freshly <b>painted</b> lawn furniture.</i>
<b>pale</b>	Turn pale as if in fear. <i>The new cheese is a <b>pale</b> imitation of continental cheeses.</i>
<b>piebald</b>	A piebald horse. <i>A <b>piebald</b> horse.</i>
<b>pied</b>	Having sections or patches colored differently and usually brightly. <i>The <b>pied</b> flycatcher.</i>
<b>pigment</b>	A substance used as a coating to protect or decorate a surface especially a mixture of pigment suspended in a liquid dries to form a hard coating. <i>The therapy masks the appearance of stretch marks by <b>pigmenting</b> skin.</i>
<b>pigmentation</b>	The deposition of pigment in animals or plants or human beings.
<b>polychrome</b>	Color with many colors make polychrome. <i>Modigliani continued to carve his large heads sometimes in <b>polychrome</b> until 1916.</i>
<b>purple</b>	Color purple. <i>The painting was mostly in shades of blue and <b>purple</b>.</i>
<b>red</b>	Of hair or fur of a reddish brown or orange brown colour. <i>With puffy <b>reddened</b> eyes.</i>
<b>smear</b>	Stain by smearing or daubing with a dirty substance. <i>There was an oil <b>smear</b> on his jacket.</i>
<b>smudge</b>	Make a smudge on soil by smudging. <i>A <b>smudge</b> of blood on the floor.</i>

<b>speck</b>	Produce specks in or on. <i>The figure in the distance had become a mere <b>speck</b>.</i>
<b>spot</b>	Make a spot or mark onto. <i>The runner up <b>spot</b>.</i>
<b>stain</b>	Be marked or be liable to be marked with a stain. <i>He regarded his time in gaol as a <b>stain</b> on his character.</i>
<b>stained</b>	(of a material or object) coloured by application of a penetrative dye or chemical. <i><b>Stained</b> timber floorboards.</i>
<b>tinge</b>	Color lightly. <i>The sadness <b>tinged</b> his life.</i>
<b>touch</b>	An act of touching someone or something. <i>There s no one who can <b>touch</b> him at lightweight judo.</i>
<b>variegate</b>	Change the appearance of, especially by marking with different colors. <i>The musicians <b>variegate</b> the pitch.</i>
