intense	Extremely sharp or intense. <i>Intense emotion.</i>
keen	(of a smell, light, or sound) penetrating; clear. <i>A keen gardener.</i>
<u>persevering</u>	Quietly and steadily persevering especially in detail or exactness. <i>With persevering or patient industry she revived the failing business.</i>
pertinacious	Holding firmly to an opinion or a course of action. <i>He worked with a pertinacious resistance to interruptions.</i>
<u>resolute</u>	Admirably purposeful, determined, and unwavering. <i>A resolute and unshakeable faith.</i>
<u>spirited</u>	Made lively or spirited. <i>A spirited campaigner for women s rights.</i>
<u>stout</u>	Having rugged physical strength; inured to fatigue or hardships. <i>Stout middle aged men.</i>
strong	Having a strong physiological or chemical effect. <i>There is a strong argument for decentralization.</i>
tenacious	Good at remembering. <i>You re tenacious and you get at the truth.</i>
unflagging	Showing sustained enthusiastic action with unflagging vitality. <i>Unflagging pursuit of excellence.</i>
untiring	Characterized by hard work and perseverance. <i>His untiring efforts in commissioning ecological reports.</i>
unwearying	Showing sustained enthusiastic action with unflagging vitality. <i>We recognize the unwearying efforts the government has made.</i>
<u>vigorous</u>	Characterized by forceful and energetic action or activity. <i>A vigorous foreign policy.</i>
<u>zealous</u>	Marked by active interest and enthusiasm. <i>The council was extremely zealous in the application of the regulations.</i>

vigorous	Characterized by or involving physical strength, effort, or energy. <i>A vigorous denial.</i>
zealotry	Excessive intolerance of opposing views. <i>He expressed concern about religious zealotry playing an increasing role in politics.</i>
