arduous	Difficult to accomplish; demanding considerable mental effort and skill. <i>The arduous work of preparing a dictionary.</i>
assiduity	Great and constant diligence and attention. <i>The assiduity with which he could wear down his opponents.</i>
cheerily	In a happy and optimistic way. <i>The children were waving cheerily.</i>
diligence	Careful and persistent work or effort. <i>Few party members challenge his diligence as an MP.</i>
diligent	Having or showing care and conscientiousness in one's work or duties. <i>A diligent detective investigates all clues.</i>
eager	A high wave (often dangerous) caused by tidal flow (as by colliding tidal currents or in a narrow estuary). <i>Young intellectuals eager for knowledge.</i>
effort	Use of physical or mental energy; hard work. <i>Contributed to the war effort.</i>
endeavor	A purposeful or industrious undertaking (especially one that requires effort or boldness). <i>Wished him luck in his endeavor.</i>
energetic	Showing or involving great activity or vitality. <i>Energetic X rays.</i>
enterprising	Marked by imagination, initiative, and readiness to undertake new projects. <i>Some enterprising teachers have started their own recycling programmes.</i>
enthusiasm	Something that arouses enthusiasm. <i>Few expressed enthusiasm about the current leaders.</i>
exertion	The application of a force, influence, or quality. <i>A well earned rest after their exertions.</i>
fervent	Hot, burning, or glowing. <i>A fervent supporter of the revolution.</i>
hard	Causing great damage or hardship. <i>It was raining hard.</i>
indefatigable	Showing sustained enthusiastic action with unflagging vitality. <i>An indefatigable defender of human rights.</i>
industrious	Working hard to promote an enterprise. <i>An industrious people striving to make their country prosperous.</i>
inexhaustible	Incapable of being entirely consumed or used up. <i>His inexhaustible energy.</i>
pains	An effortful attempt to attain a goal.

<u>painstaking</u>	Characterized by extreme care and great effort. <i>He is a gentle painstaking man.</i>
<u>steady</u>	Make or become steady. Steady nerves.
strenuous	Taxing to the utmost; testing powers of endurance- F.D.Roosevelt. Strenuous exercise.
striving	An effortful attempt to attain a goal.
submerge	Put under water. <i>Pellets were then submersed in agar.</i>
torrid	Very hot and dry. <i>Hot trumpets and torrid rhythms.</i>
try	An act of trying something new or different to see if it is suitable effective or pleasant. <i>You are trying my patience.</i>
unflagging	Showing sustained enthusiastic action with unflagging vitality. Unflagging pursuit of excellence.
<u>vigorous</u>	Strong and active physically or mentally. <i>A tall vigorous and muscular man.</i>
zealotry	Excessive intolerance of opposing views. <i>He expressed concern about religious zealotry playing an increasing role in politics.</i>
