A **pedestrian** movie plot.

Having or using the style or diction of prose as opposed to poetry; lacking

**prosaic** imaginativeness or originality.

The masses were too preoccupied by **prosaic** day to day concerns.

**quotidian** Found in the ordinary course of events.

His story is an achingly human one mired in **quotidian** details.

repetitious Characterized by repetition.

Many hours of **repetitious** labour.

Repetitive and persistent.

repetitive A repetitive task.

Found in the ordinary course of events- Anita Diamant.

The Ministry insisted that this was just a **routine** annual drill.

run-of-the-mill Not special in any way.



slow Slow to learn or understand lacking intellectual acuity.

A **slow** process.

tedious Too long, slow, or dull; tiresome or monotonous.

**Tedious** days on the train.

troublesome Difficult to deal with.

A **troublesome** situation.

**trying** Hard to endure.

It had been a very **trying** day.

**uneventful**Not marked by interesting or exciting events.

A place where dull people lead uneventful lives.

**unexciting** Not stimulating.

Many school prospectuses are dull and **unexciting**.

**uninteresting** Arousing no interest or attention or curiosity or excitement.

**unremarkable** Found in the ordinary course of events.

workaday Found in the ordinary course of events.



ponderous Having great mass and weight and unwieldiness.

**prolixity** Boring verbosity.

prosaic Lacking wit or imagination.

A **prosaic** and unimaginative essay.

Too long, slow, or dull; tiresome or monotonous.

**Tedious** days on the train.

**tedium** Dullness owing to length or slowness.
