### **Definitions of "Tiring" as an adjective**

- *Producing exhaustion.*
- *Causing one to need rest or sleep; fatiguing.*



### Synonyms of "Tiring" as an adjective (3 Words)

**exhausting** Making one feel very tired; very tiring.  
*An **exhausting** job in the hot sun.*

**wearing** Producing exhaustion.  
*A plan of action will make the whole event a less **wearing** experience.*

**wearying** Physically and mentally fatigued.  
*A long **wearying** journey.*

## Associations of "Tiring" (30 Words)

<b>bored</b>	Tired of the world. <i>Strolled through the museum with a <b>bored</b> air.</i>
<b>boredom</b>	The state of feeling bored. <i>I ll die of <b>boredom</b> if I live that long.</i>
<b>boring</b>	Not interesting; tedious. <i>A <b>boring</b> evening with uninteresting people.</i>
<b>bromide</b>	A reproduction or piece of typesetting on bromide paper. <i>Feel good <b>bromides</b> create the illusion of problem solving.</i>
<b>dull</b>	Make or become dull or less intense. <i>A <b>dull</b> glow.</i>

<b>ennui</b>	A feeling of listlessness and dissatisfaction arising from a lack of occupation or excitement. <i>He succumbed to <b>ennui</b> and despair.</i>
<b>exhausting</b>	Producing exhaustion. <i>An <b>exhausting</b> march.</i>
<b>frustrating</b>	Causing annoyance or upset because of an inability to change or achieve something. <i>It can be very <b>frustrating</b> to find that the size you want isn't there.</i>
<b>grueling</b>	Characterized by effort to the point of exhaustion; especially physical effort. <i>A <b>grueling</b> campaign.</i>
<b>hesitance</b>	A feeling of diffidence and indecision about doing something. <i>They agreed to go along after initial <b>hesitance</b>.</i>
<b>humdrum</b>	Monotonous routine. <i>He was sick of the <b>humdrum</b> of his fellow prisoners.</i>
<b>irksome</b>	Irritating; annoying. <i>What an <b>irksome</b> task the writing of long letters is.</i>
<b>lackluster</b>	Lacking brilliance or vitality. <i>A dull <b>lackluster</b> life.</i>
<b>leaden</b>	Dull, heavy, or slow. <i>A <b>leaden</b> coffin.</i>
<b>monotonous</b>	Dull, tedious, and repetitious; lacking in variety and interest. <i>The owl's faint <b>monotonous</b> hooting.</i>
<b>onerous</b>	(of a task or responsibility) involving a great deal of effort, trouble, or difficulty. <i>He found his duties increasingly <b>onerous</b>.</i>
<b>prolixity</b>	Boring verbosity.
<b>prosaic</b>	Having or using the style or diction of prose as opposed to poetry; lacking imaginativeness or originality. <i>A <b>prosaic</b> and unimaginative essay.</i>
<b>taxing</b>	Not easily borne; wearing. <i>A <b>taxing</b> schedule.</i>
<b>tedious</b>	Too long, slow, or dull; tiresome or monotonous. <i>A <b>tedious</b> journey.</i>
<b>tired</b>	Repeated too often; overfamiliar through overuse. <i>Too <b>tired</b> to eat.</i>

<b><u>tiresome</u></b>	So lacking in interest as to cause mental weariness. <i>Weeding is a <b>tiresome</b> but essential job.</i>
<b>toilsome</b>	Characterized by effort to the point of exhaustion; especially physical effort. <i><b>Toilsome</b> chores.</i>
<b>uninteresting</b>	Characteristic or suggestive of an institution especially in being uniform or dull or unimaginative. <i>A very <b>uninteresting</b> account of her trip.</i>
<b>unvaried</b>	Not involving change. <i>A plain <b>unvaried</b> diet.</i>
<b><u>vapid</u></b>	Offering nothing that is stimulating or challenging; bland. <i><b>Vapid</b> tea.</i>
<b>verbose</b>	Using or expressed in more words than are needed. <i><b>Verbose</b> and ineffective instructional methods.</i>
<b>wearing</b>	Geology the mechanical process of wearing or grinding something down as by particles washing over it. <i>It would be a lot less <b>wearing</b> if we could work together amicably.</i>
<b>wearisome</b>	So lacking in interest as to cause mental weariness. <i>They have schedules and inventories that tell them in <b>wearisome</b> detail what they should look for.</i>
