Definitions of "Titan" as a noun

According to the [Oxford Dictionary of English](#), “titan” as a noun can have the following definitions:

- *A person of exceptional importance and reputation.*
- *Any of the primordial giant gods who ruled the Earth until overthrown by Zeus; the Titans were offspring of Uranus (Heaven) and Gaea (Earth).*
- *A person or thing of very great strength, intellect, or importance.*
- *(Greek mythology) any of the primordial giant gods who ruled the Earth until overthrown by Zeus; the Titans were offspring of Uranus (Heaven) and Gaea (Earth).*
- *The largest of the satellites of Saturn; has a hazy nitrogen atmosphere.*



Synonyms of "Titan" as a noun (4 Words)

<u>behemoth</u>	A huge or monstrous creature. <i>Shoppers are now more loyal to their local shops than to faceless behemoths.</i>
colossus	Someone or something that is abnormally large and powerful. <i>The Russian Empire was the colossus of European politics.</i>
giant	A very bright star of large diameter and low density (relative to the Sun). <i>A giant among sportsmen.</i>
heavyweight	A heavyweight boxer or other competitor. <i>A political heavyweight with national recognition.</i>



Usage Examples of "Titan" as a noun

- A titan of American industry.
- The break-up reduced the political clout of a corporate titan.
