Synonyms of "Tizzy" as a noun (19 Words)

agitation	A state of agitation or turbulent change or development. <i>She was wringing her hands in agitation.</i>
brouhaha	Loud confused noise from many sources. All that election brouhaha .
<u>commotion</u>	Civil insurrection. Damage caused by civil commotion .
confusion	Uncertainty about what is happening, intended, or required. Most of the errors are reasonable confusion s between similar words.
<u>disturbance</u>	A state in which normal mental or physical functioning is disrupted. They were amazed by the furious disturbance they had caused.



dither	An excited state of agitation. After months of dither ministers had still not agreed.
<u>flap</u>	An act of flapping something typically a wing or arm up and down or from side to side. There was a terrible flap about the theft.
<u>fuss</u>	An angry disturbance. They settled in with very little fuss .
hubbub	Loud confused noise from many sources. She fought through the hubbub .
outcry	A loud utterance; often in protest or opposition. <i>The public outcry over the bombing.</i>
palaver	Loud and confused and empty talk. There s a lot of palaver involved.
pandemonium	Wild and noisy disorder or confusion; uproar. There was complete pandemonium everyone just panicked.
pother	A commotion or fuss. What a pother you make.
<u>tempest</u>	(literary) a violent wind. <i>A raging tempest</i> .
to-do	A disorderly outburst or tumult.
tumult	The act of making a noisy disturbance. The whole neighbourhood was in a state of fear and tumult .
<u>turmoil</u>	A violent disturbance. <i>He endured years of inner turmoil.</i>
<u>uproar</u>	A loud and impassioned noise or disturbance. <i>It caused an uproar in the press.</i>
upset	The act of upsetting something. His carelessness could have caused an ecological upset .

Usage Examples of "Tizzy" as a noun
