| brouhaha | Loud confused noise from many sources. <i>All that election brouhaha.</i> |
| commotion | Civil insurrection. <i>Damage caused by civil commotion.</i> |
| confusion | Uncertainty about what is happening, intended, or required. <i>Most of the errors are reasonable confusions between similar words.</i> |
| disturbance | A state in which normal mental or physical functioning is disrupted. <i>They were amazed by the furious disturbance they had caused.</i> |

| dither | An excited state of agitation. <i>After months of dither ministers had still not agreed.</i> |
| flap | An act of flapping something typically a wing or arm up and down or from side to side. <i>There was a terrible flap about the theft.</i> |
| fuss | An angry disturbance. <i>They settled in with very little fuss.</i> |
| hubbub | Loud confused noise from many sources. <i>She fought through the hubbub.</i> |
| outcry | A loud utterance; often in protest or opposition. <i>The public outcry over the bombing.</i> |
| palaver | Loud and confused and empty talk. <i>There s a lot of palaver involved.</i> |
| pandemonium | Wild and noisy disorder or confusion; uproar. <i>There was complete pandemonium everyone just panicked.</i> |
| pother | A commotion or fuss. <i>What a pother you make.</i> |
| tempest | (literary) a violent wind. <i>A raging tempest.</i> |
| to-do | A disorderly outburst or tumult. |
| tumult | The act of making a noisy disturbance. <i>The whole neighbourhood was in a state of fear and tumult.</i> |
| turmoil | A violent disturbance. <i>He endured years of inner turmoil.</i> |
| uproar | A loud and impassioned noise or disturbance. <i>It caused an uproar in the press.</i> |
| upset | The act of upsetting something. <i>His carelessness could have caused an ecological upset.</i> |
