## Associations of "To begin with" (30 Words)

<b>afresh</b>	In a new or different way. <i>She left the job to start <b>afresh</b>.</i>
<b><a href="#">anew</a></b>	In a new or different and typically more positive way. <i>Tears filled her eyes <b>anew</b>.</i>
<b>beginning</b>	The background or origins of a person or organization. <i>The ending of one relationship and the <b>beginning</b> of another.</i>
<b>coming</b>	The temporal property of becoming nearer in time. <i>Work is due to start in the <b>coming</b> year.</i>
<b><a href="#">commence</a></b>	Take the first step or steps in carrying out an action. <i>His design team <b>commenced</b> work.</i>
<b><a href="#">emanate</a></b>	Proceed or issue forth, as from a source. <i>Water <b>emanates</b> from this hole in the ground.</i>
<b>germinal</b>	Seventh month of the Revolutionary calendar (March and April); the month of buds. <i>A <b>germinal</b> idea.</i>
<b>inaugural</b>	An address delivered at an inaugural ceremony especially by a United States president. <i>His <b>inaugural</b> concert as Music Director.</i>
<b>inaugurate</b>	Admit (someone) formally to office. <i>The new President will be <b>inaugurated</b> on January 20.</i>
<b>initiate</b>	A person who has been initiated into an organization or activity. <i>It is very familiar to the <b>initiate</b>.</i>
<b><a href="#">initiative</a></b>	Serving to set in motion. <i>A new <b>initiative</b> against car crime.</i>
<b>innovate</b>	Make changes in something established, especially by introducing new methods, ideas, or products. <i>The company's failure to diversify and <b>innovate</b> competitively.</i>

<b>introduce</b>	Introduce. <i>Bills can be <b>introduced</b> in either House of Parliament.</i>
<b>introductory</b>	Serving as a base or starting point. <i>Began the slide show with some <b>introductory</b> remarks.</i>
<b>launch</b>	An act or instance of launching something. <i>A chair was <b>launched</b> at him.</i>
<b>mount</b>	A mounting consisting of a piece of metal as in a ring or other jewelry that holds a gem in place. <i>Fluorescent lights are <b>mounted</b> on the ceiling.</i>
<b>new</b>	Newly recently. <i>This would be her <b>new</b> home.</i>
<b>officially</b>	With official authorization. <i>There is a possibility he was murdered <b>officially</b> he died in a car smash.</i>
<b>originate</b>	Have a specified beginning. <i>The flight <b>originates</b> in Calcutta.</i>
<b>pioneer</b>	Open up a road or terrain as a pioneer. <i>They went west as <b>pioneers</b> with only the possessions they could carry with them.</i>
<b>preamble</b>	The introductory part of a statute or deed, stating its purpose, aims, and justification. <i>I gave him the bad news without <b>preamble</b>.</i>
<b>profile</b>	Represent in profile by drawing or painting. <i>A sleep <b>profile</b> for someone on a shift system.</i>
<b>pundit</b>	Someone who has been admitted to membership in a scholarly field. <i>Political <b>pundits</b> were tipping him for promotion.</i>
<b>resume</b>	Begin again or continue after a pause or interruption. <i>The painting <b>resumed</b> its old condition when we restored it.</i>
<b>savant</b>	A learned person, especially a distinguished scientist.
<b>start</b>	A line indicating the location of the start of a race or a game. <i>I <b>started</b> to chat to him.</i>
<b>starting</b>	A turn to be a starter (in a game at the beginning). <i>Hands in the <b>starting</b> position.</i>
<b>stirring</b>	Capable of arousing enthusiasm or excitement. <i><b>Stirring</b> events such as wars and rescues.</i>
<b>summarize</b>	Give a brief statement of the main points of (something). <i>I will now <b>summarize</b>.</i>
