afresh	In a new or different way. <i>She left the job to start afresh.</i>
anew	In a new or different and typically more positive way. <i>Tears filled her eyes anew.</i>
beginning	The background or origins of a person or organization. <i>The ending of one relationship and the beginning of another.</i>
coming	The temporal property of becoming nearer in time. <i>Work is due to start in the coming year.</i>
commence	Take the first step or steps in carrying out an action. <i>His design team commenced work.</i>
emanate	Proceed or issue forth, as from a source. <i>Water emanates from this hole in the ground.</i>
germinal	Seventh month of the Revolutionary calendar (March and April); the month of buds. <i>A germinal idea.</i>
inaugural	An address delivered at an inaugural ceremony especially by a United States president. <i>His inaugural concert as Music Director.</i>
inaugurate	Admit (someone) formally to office. <i>The new President will be inaugurated on January 20.</i>
initiate	A person who has been initiated into an organization or activity. <i>It is very familiar to the initiate.</i>
initiative	Serving to set in motion. <i>A new initiative against car crime.</i>
innovate	Make changes in something established, especially by introducing new methods, ideas, or products. <i>The company's failure to diversify and innovate competitively.</i>

introduce	Introduce. <i>Bills can be introduced in either House of Parliament.</i>
introductory	Serving as a base or starting point. <i>Began the slide show with some introductory remarks.</i>
launch	An act or instance of launching something. <i>A chair was launched at him.</i>
mount	A mounting consisting of a piece of metal as in a ring or other jewelry that holds a gem in place. <i>Fluorescent lights are mounted on the ceiling.</i>
new	Newly recently. <i>This would be her new home.</i>
officially	With official authorization. <i>There is a possibility he was murdered officially he died in a car smash.</i>
originate	Have a specified beginning. <i>The flight originates in Calcutta.</i>
pioneer	Open up a road or terrain as a pioneer. <i>They went west as pioneers with only the possessions they could carry with them.</i>
preamble	The introductory part of a statute or deed, stating its purpose, aims, and justification. <i>I gave him the bad news without preamble.</i>
profile	Represent in profile by drawing or painting. <i>A sleep profile for someone on a shift system.</i>
pundit	Someone who has been admitted to membership in a scholarly field. <i>Political pundits were tipping him for promotion.</i>
resume	Begin again or continue after a pause or interruption. <i>The painting resumed its old condition when we restored it.</i>
savant	A learned person, especially a distinguished scientist.
start	A line indicating the location of the start of a race or a game. <i>I started to chat to him.</i>
starting	A turn to be a starter (in a game at the beginning). <i>Hands in the starting position.</i>
stirring	Capable of arousing enthusiasm or excitement. <i>Stirring events such as wars and rescues.</i>
summarize	Give a brief statement of the main points of (something). <i>I will now summarize.</i>

trailblazer A person who makes a new track through wild country.
*He was a **trailblazer** for many ideas that are now standard fare.*
