- *Slices of bread that have been toasted.*
- *A call to a gathering of people to raise their glasses and drink together in honour of a person or thing, or an instance of drinking in this way.*
- *A person or thing that is very popular or held in high regard by a particular group of people.*
- *A drink in honor of or to the health of a person or event.*
- *Sliced bread browned on both sides by exposure to radiant heat, such as a grill or fire.*
- *A person in desperate straits; someone doomed.*

salutation (usually plural) an acknowledgment or expression of good will (especially on meeting).
*We greeted them but no one returned our **salutations**.*

salute A formal military gesture of respect.
*He raises his arms in a triumphant **salute**.*

talk The act of giving a talk to an audience.
*My mother had a **talk** with Louis.*

tribute Payment by one nation for protection by another.
*A **tribute** show.*

- *One mistake and you're toast.*
- *He raised his glass in a toast to his son.*
- *He was the toast of the town.*

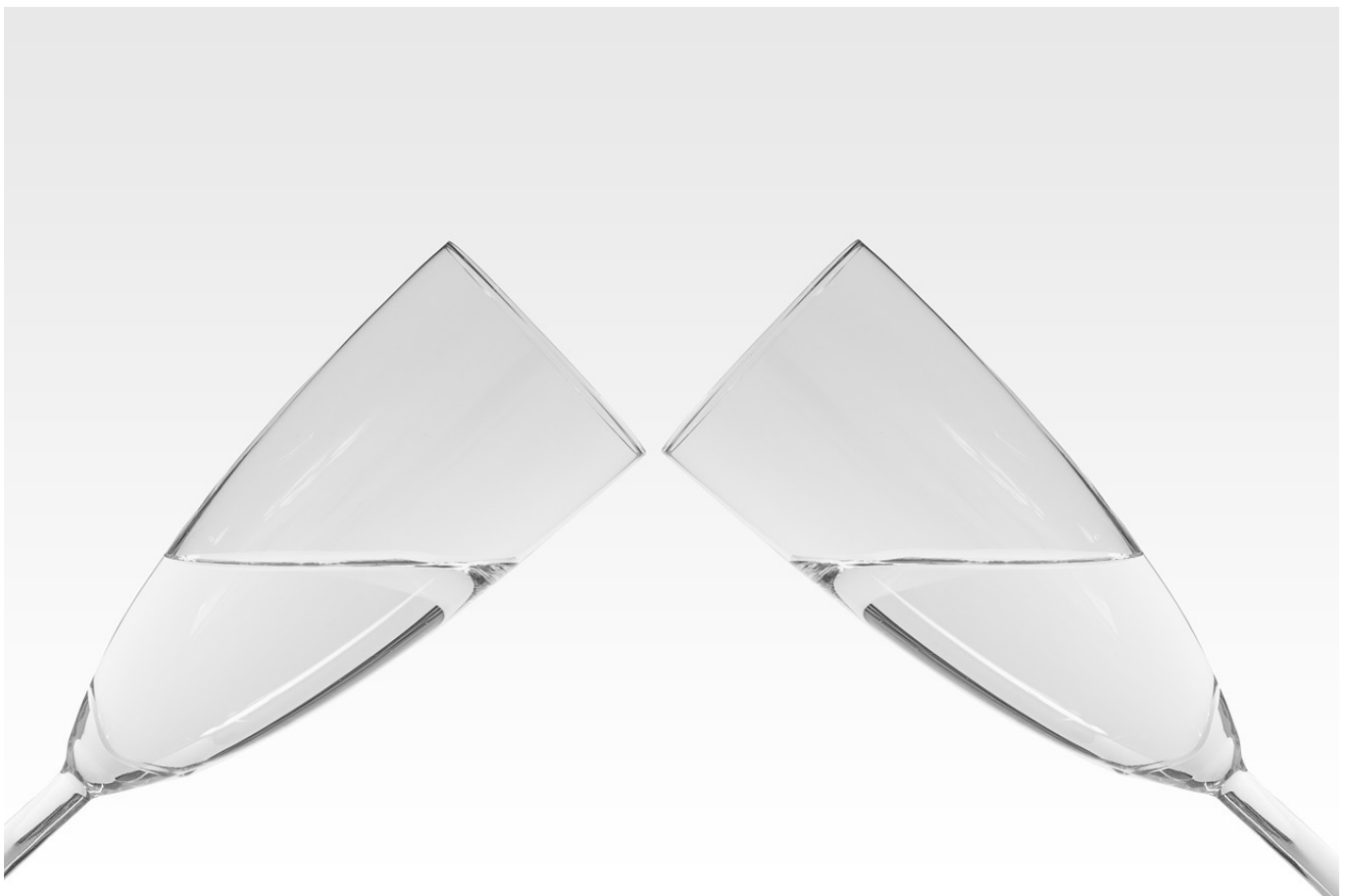


Toast as a Verb

Definitions of "Toast" as a verb

According to the [Oxford Dictionary of English](#), "toast" as a verb can have the following definitions:

- Warm (oneself or part of one's body) in front of a fire or other source or heat.
- Propose a toast to.
- (of food) cook or become brown by exposure to radiant heat.
- Make brown and crisp by heating.
- Cook or brown (food, especially bread or cheese) by exposure to a grill, fire, or other source of radiant heat.
- Drink to the health or in honour of (someone or something) by raising one's glass together with others.



Synonyms of "Toast" as a verb (25 Words)

- bake** Cook and make edible by putting in a hot oven.
***Bake** a cake.*
- barbecue** Cook outdoors on a barbecue grill.
*Let's **barbecue** that meat.*
- bring back to life** Cause to happen or to occur as a consequence.

| grill | Cook over a grill. <i>My father grilled us about what we had been doing.</i> |

| heat up | Arouse or excite feelings and passions. |
| honour | Accept as pay. <i>Talented writers were honoured at a special ceremony.</i> |
| pay tribute to | Convey, as of a compliment, regards, attention, etc.; bestow. |
| pledge | Bind or secure by a pledge. <i>I was pledged to silence.</i> |
| roast | Of food be cooked by roasting. <i>The fire was hot enough to roast anyone who stood close to it.</i> |
| salute | Make a formal salute to. <i>We salute a truly great photographer.</i> |
| sear | Fry (food) quickly at a high temperature so that it will retain its juices in subsequent cooking. <i>Sear the chicken livers in a pan for a few minutes on each side.</i> |
| singe | Burn (something) superficially or lightly. <i>The fire had singed his eyebrows.</i> |
| take the chill off | Remove something concrete, as by lifting, pushing, or taking off, or remove something abstract. |
| warm | Make or become warm. <i>I ll warm your bum if you don t come here this instant.</i> |

warm up

Get warm or warmer.

wassail

Celebrate noisily, often indulging in drinking; engage in uproarious festivities.

*It is the custom in the cider districts of Sussex to **wassail** the apple trees.*

- bacon** English scientist and Franciscan monk who stressed the importance of experimentation; first showed that air is required for combustion and first used lenses to correct vision (1220-1292).
*Crisp rashers of **bacon**.*
- bake** A social gathering at which baked food of a specified kind is eaten.
***Bake** the potatoes.*
- baked** (of food) cooked by dry heat in an oven.
*Land lying **baked** in the heat.*
- batter** Strike repeatedly with hard blows.
*The loss of his baby turned him into a domineering bully who **battered** his partner.*
- bread** Coat food with breadcrumbs before cooking.
*A **bread** roll.*

| fry | A social gathering where fried food is served. <i>With the sea and sun and wind you ll fry if you don t take care.</i> |
| grill | A dish of grilled food especially meat. <i>Grill the trout for five minutes.</i> |
| ham | (Old Testament) son of Noah. <i>He squatted down on his hams.</i> |
| jam | A hold obtained by jamming a part of the body such as a hand or foot into a crack in the rock. <i>An ultra catchy jam driven by the drums but given substance by the interjection of horns.</i> |
| oven | Kitchen appliance used for baking or roasting. <i>Bake the dish in a preheated oven.</i> |

- pancake** With reference to an aircraft make or cause to make a pancake landing.
*Hurley's car was **pancaked**.*
- recipe** A medical prescription.
*It would be useless to enumerate all the drugs and **recipes** for their application which have been tried.*
- sandwich** Something that is constructed like or has the form of a sandwich.
*A ham **sandwich**.*
- sauce** Provide a sauce for something season with a sauce.
*Tomato **sauce**.*
- sausage** An object shaped like a sausage.
*Silly **sausage** he teased.*
- saute** A dish of sauteed food.
***Saute** the onions.*
- smoked** (of food, especially meat or fish) cured or preserved by exposure to smoke.
*They were hidden behind the **smoked** glass of their limos.*
- toaster** A DJ who accompanies reggae with improvised rhythmic speech.
- waffle** Pancake batter baked in a waffle iron.
*He **waffled** on about his problems.*
