
Toast as a Noun

- Sliced bread browned on both sides by exposure to radiant heat, such as a grill or fire.
- A person in desperate straits; someone doomed.


Toast as a Verb

Definitions of "Toast" as a verb

According to the Oxford Dictionary of English, "toast" as a verb can have the following definitions:



- Warm (oneself or part of one's body) in front of a fire or other source or heat.
- Propose a toast to.
- (of food) cook or become brown by exposure to radiant heat.
- Make brown and crisp by heating.
- Cook or brown (food, especially bread or cheese) by exposure to a grill, fire, or other source of radiant heat.
- Drink to the health or in honour of (someone or something) by raising one's glass together with others.
