- young one** United States religious leader of the Mormon Church after the assassination of Joseph Smith; he led the Mormon exodus from Illinois to Salt Lake City, Utah (1801-1877).

youngster A young person of either sex.
*Tiddler is a British term for **youngster**.*

<u>infant</u>	A person who has not attained legal majority. <i>Infant mortality.</i>
<u>juvenile</u>	An actor playing a juvenile role. <i>The law relating to the sentencing of juveniles.</i>
kindergarten	A preschool for children age 4 to 6 to prepare them for primary school.
mare	A dark region of considerable extent on the surface of the moon. <i>That crazy mare put three bullets in him.</i>
mom	Informal terms for a mother. <i>My mom gave us each a slice of pizza.</i>
newborn	A baby from birth to four weeks. <i>A newborn star.</i>
nursery	A place where young children are cared for during the working day a nursery school. <i>This estuary provides a vast nursery for fish.</i>
orphanage	The condition of being a child without living parents. <i>His early orphanage shaped his character as an adult.</i>
playground	An area where many people go for recreation. <i>Playground games.</i>
playpen	A portable enclosure in which babies may be left to play.
playroom	A room in a house that is set aside for children to play in.
preschool	A nursery school. <i>A preschool playgroup.</i>
preschooler	A child who attends a preschool or kindergarten. <i>The show aimed at preschoolers emphasizes the importance of storytelling.</i>
<u>primary</u>	A primary feather. <i>Seed eating birds and herbivorous insects are primary consumers.</i>
raising	The properties acquired as a consequence of the way you were treated as a child. <i>A raising of the land resulting from volcanic activity.</i>

- rearing** Rearing on left hind leg with forelegs elevated and head usually in profile.
- reformatory** Tending to reform.
Reformatory punishment.
- schooling** The process of being formally educated at a school.
*His parents paid for his **schooling**.*
- stallion** An uncastrated adult male horse.
- yearling** Having lived for a year; a year old.
*A **yearling** calf.*
