**youngster** A young person of either sex.

<b>incubation</b>	Sitting on eggs so as to hatch them by the warmth of the body. <i>The chick hatches after a month s <b>incubation</b>.</i>
<b>infant</b>	A person who has not attained legal majority. <i><b>Infant</b> mortality.</i>
<b>juvenile</b>	An actor playing a juvenile role. <i>The law relating to the sentencing of <b>juveniles</b>.</i>
<b>kindergarten</b>	A preschool for children age 4 to 6 to prepare them for primary school.
<b>mare</b>	A dark region of considerable extent on the surface of the moon. <i>That crazy <b>mare</b> put three bullets in him.</i>
<b>mom</b>	Informal terms for a mother. <i>My <b>mom</b> gave us each a slice of pizza.</i>
<b>newborn</b>	A baby from birth to four weeks. <i>A <b>newborn</b> star.</i>
<b>nursery</b>	A place where young children are cared for during the working day a nursery school. <i>This estuary provides a vast <b>nursery</b> for fish.</i>
<b>orphanage</b>	The condition of being a child without living parents. <i>His early <b>orphanage</b> shaped his character as an adult.</i>
<b>playground</b>	An area where many people go for recreation. <i><b>Playground</b> games.</i>
<b>playpen</b>	A portable enclosure in which babies may be left to play.
<b>playroom</b>	A room in a house that is set aside for children to play in.
<b>preschool</b>	A nursery school. <i>A <b>preschool</b> playgroup.</i>
<b>preschooler</b>	A child who attends a preschool or kindergarten. <i>The show aimed at <b>preschoolers</b> emphasizes the importance of storytelling.</i>
<b>primary</b>	A primary feather. <i>Seed eating birds and herbivorous insects are <b>primary</b> consumers.</i>
<b>raising</b>	The properties acquired as a consequence of the way you were treated as a child. <i>A <b>raising</b> of the land resulting from volcanic activity.</i>



- rearing** Rearing on left hind leg with forelegs elevated and head usually in profile.
- reformatory** Tending to reform.

- schooling** The process of being formally educated at a school.  
*His parents paid for his **schooling**.*
- stallion** An uncastrated adult male horse.
- yearling** Having lived for a year; a year old.  
*A **yearling** calf.*
