## Synonyms of "Togetherness" as a noun (20 Words)

- accord** Sympathetic compatibility.  
*The government and the rebels are in **accord** on one point.*
- affinity** The degree to which a substance tends to combine with another.  
*The bacterial proteins bind to these molecules with high **affinity**.*
- agreement** Harmony or accordance in opinion or feeling.  
*A trade **agreement**.*
- association** (chemistry) any process of combination (especially in solution) that depends on relatively weak chemical bonding.  
*There s nothing new in the **association** of fasting with spirituality.*
- closeness** The quality of being only a short distance away or apart in space or time.  
*The geographical **closeness** of our two countries.*
- communication** The imparting or exchanging of information by speaking, writing, or using some other medium.  
*Television is an effective means of **communication**.*

<b>community</b>	A group of people having a religion, ethnic, profession, or other particular characteristic in common. <b>Community</b> health services.
<b>concord</b>	Town in eastern Massachusetts near Boston where the first battle of the American Revolution was fought. A <b>concord</b> was to be drawn up.
<b>connection</b>	(usually plural) a person who is influential and to whom you are connected in some way (as by family or friendship). The plane was late and he missed his <b>connection</b> in Atlanta.
<b>empathy</b>	The ability to understand and share the feelings of another.
<b>fellow feeling</b>	A boy or man.
<b>fellowship</b>	Money granted (by a university or foundation or other agency) for advanced study or research. A <b>fellowship</b> in mathematics.
<b>friendship</b>	The emotions or conduct of friends; the state of being friends. Old ties of love and <b>friendship</b> .
<b>harmony</b>	An arrangement of the four Gospels, or of any parallel narratives, which presents a single continuous narrative text. The piece owes its air of tranquillity largely to the <b>harmony</b> .
<b>kinship</b>	Relatedness or connection by blood or marriage or adoption. Felt a deep <b>kinship</b> with the other students.
<b>rapport</b>	A relationship of mutual understanding or trust and agreement between people. She had an instant <b>rapport</b> with animals.
<b>sharing</b>	Sharing thoughts and feelings. The <b>sharing</b> of electrons creates molecules.
<b>sympathy</b>	Sharing the feelings of others (especially feelings of sorrow or anguish). Repairs had to be in <b>sympathy</b> with the original structure.
<b>understanding</b>	The ability to understand something; comprehension. He and I have an <b>understanding</b> .
<b>unity</b>	Each of the three dramatic principles requiring limitation of the supposed time of a drama to that occupied in acting it or to a single day unity of time use of one scene throughout unity of place and concentration on the development of a single plot unity of action. Ways of preserving family <b>unity</b> .

<b>ally</b>	Become an ally or associate as by a treaty or marriage. <i>He was forced to dismiss his closest political <b>ally</b>.</i>
<b>amalgamate</b>	Alloy (a metal) with mercury. <i>The <b>amalgamated</b> colleges constituted a university.</i>
<b>bilateral</b>	Having two sides or parts. <i>The <b>bilateral</b> agreements with Japan.</i>
<b>coalesced</b>	Joined together into a whole.
<b>collaborate</b>	Cooperate traitorously with an enemy. <i>He <b>collaborated</b> with him on numerous hotel projects.</i>
<b>collaborative</b>	Accomplished by collaboration. <i><b>Collaborative</b> research.</i>
<b>combine</b>	Combine so as to form a whole mix. <i>One of the world s biggest food and personal products <b>combines</b>.</i>

<b><u>communal</u></b>	Involving the sharing of work and property. <i>A <b>communal</b> settlement in which all earnings and food were shared.</i>
<b>concerted</b>	Done with great effort or determination. <i><b>Concerted</b> secular music for voices.</i>
<b>concurrent</b>	(of three or more lines) meeting at or tending towards one point. <i>There are three <b>concurrent</b> art fairs around the city.</i>
<b>cooperation</b>	The formation and operation of cooperatives. <i>Their <b>cooperation</b> with us was essential for the success of our mission.</i>
<b><u>cooperative</u></b>	Involving mutual assistance in working towards a common goal. <i>We run the agency as a workers <b>cooperative</b>.</i>
<b>coordinated</b>	Being dexterous in the use of more than one set of muscle movements- Mary McCarthy. <i>Curtains and walls were color <b>coordinated</b>.</i>
<b>federate</b>	Relating to a federated state or organization. <i>The country was <b>federated</b> after the civil war.</i>
<b><u>friendship</u></b>	A state of mutual trust and support between allied nations. <i>Because of the <b>friendship</b> between our countries we had a very frank exchange.</i>
<b>hinge</b>	A natural joint which performs a function similar to that of a man made hinge for example that of a bivalve shell. <i>The future of the industry could <b>hinge</b> on the outcome of next month s election.</i>
<b>integrate</b>	Become one become integrated. <i>Cities efforts to <b>integrate</b>.</i>
<b>integrated</b>	Formed or united into a whole. <i>A more closely <b>integrated</b> economic and political system.</i>
<b>interconnect</b>	Cause to be interconnected or interwoven. <i>The way human activities <b>interconnect</b> with the environment.</i>
<b>join</b>	Cause to become joined or linked. <i>I <b>joined</b> the demonstration.</i>
<b>joint</b>	Fit as if by joints. <i>Listen to one of his <b>joints</b> nowadays and you don t even need to see the production credit.</i>
<b>multilateral</b>	Having members or contributors from several groups, especially several different countries. <i><b>Multilateral</b> nuclear disarmament.</i>
<b><u>mutual</u></b>	A mutual building society or insurance company. <i>The world s oldest <b>mutual</b> insurance company.</i>

- reciprocal** Something a term or expression or concept that has a reciprocal relation to something else.  
***Reciprocal** privileges at other clubs.*
- sync** Make synchronous and adjust in time or manner.

- tripartite** Shared by or involving three parties.  
*A **tripartite** treaty.*
- unified** Formed or united into a whole.  
*A **unified** utility system.*
