Associations of "Told" (30 Words)

aforementioned	Being the one previously mentioned or spoken of. <i>Works of all the aforementioned authors.</i>
aforesaid	Being the one previously mentioned or spoken of.
announce	Announce publicly or officially. <i>The President s office announced that the siege would be lifted.</i>
articulate	Having or showing the ability to speak fluently and coherently. <i>They were unable to articulate their emotions.</i>
aver	To declare or affirm solemnly and formally as true. <i>The defendant does not aver any performance by himself.</i>
describe	Give a description of. <i>He described his experiences in a letter to his parents.</i>
enunciate	Express (a proposition, theory, etc.) in clear or definite terms. <i>She enunciated each word slowly.</i>
expansive	Of behavior that is impressive and ambitious in scale or scope. <i>He was in an expansive mood.</i>
explain	Define. <i>The committee explained their plan for fund raising to the Dean.</i>
expository	Serving to expound or set forth. <i>An expository prologue.</i>
expound	Add details, as to an account or idea; clarify the meaning of and discourse in a learned way, usually in writing. <i>The abbess expounded the scriptures to her nuns.</i>
inform	Give incriminating information about someone to the police or other authority. <i>The principles that inform modern teaching.</i>
informing	To furnish incriminating evidence to an officer of the law (usually in return for favors.

<u>narrate</u>	Narrate or give a detailed account of. <i>The series is narrated by Richard Baker.</i>
notification	Informing by words. <i>We have yet to receive formal notification of the announcement.</i>
pronouncement	An authoritative declaration. <i>Distrust of the pronouncements of politicians was endemic.</i>
<u>quote</u>	A passage or expression that is quoted or cited. <i>Quotes for North Sea Brent were rising.</i>
<u>recite</u>	Recite in elocution. <i>She recited the dates and names of kings and queens.</i>
<u>recount</u>	Tell someone about something; give an account of an event or experience. <i>He recounts how they often talked of politics.</i>
remark	Say something as a comment; mention. <i>He remarked that he had some work to finish.</i>
remind	Assist (somebody acting or reciting) by suggesting the next words of something forgotten or imperfectly learned. <i>His impassive fierce stare reminded her of an owl.</i>
report	Be responsible for reporting the details of as in journalism. <i>Whatever things are lovely and of good report.</i>
reportedly	According to reports or other information. <i>He was in El Salvador reportedly on his way to Texas.</i>
saying	A short, pithy, commonly known expression which generally offers advice or wisdom. <i>This is stated in the sayings of the Prophet.</i>
snitch	Steal. <i>She was snitching a look out of the window.</i>
<u>soliloquy</u>	A part of a play involving a soliloquy. <i>In the opening soliloquy he declares his true intent.</i>
speak	Utter (a word, message, etc). <i>They speak a strange dialect.</i>
talk	Exchange thoughts talk with. <i>There is talk of an armistice.</i>
<u>utter</u>	Express audibly utter sounds not necessarily words. <i>Utter seriousness.</i>
<u>verbalize</u>	Speak, especially at length and with little real content. <i>This depressed patient does not verbalize.</i>
