- *Fairly good; mediocre.*
- *Capable of being borne or endured.*
- *Able to be endured.*



Synonyms of "Tolerable" as an adjective (18 Words)

acceptable

Able to be tolerated or allowed.

*Performances varied from **acceptable** to excellent.*

adequate

Having the requisite qualities or resources to meet a task.

*She was **adequate** to the job.*

all right

Quantifier; used with either mass or count nouns to indicate the whole number or amount of or every one of a class.

average

Relating to or constituting the middle value of an ordered set of values or the average of the middle two in a set with an even number of values.

*A novel of **average** merit.*

bearable

Able to be endured.

*Things to make life in the tropics more **bearable**.*

<u>decent</u>	Decently clothed. <i>There s a few decent players in the team.</i>
endurable	Able to be endured; bearable. <i>My journey was long but endurable.</i>
fair	Free from favoritism or self-interest or bias or deception; conforming with established standards or rules. <i>By fair means or foul.</i>
fair to middling	Attractively feminine.
good enough	Appealing to the mind.
not bad	Physically unsound or diseased.
passable	Just good enough to be acceptable; satisfactory. <i>The road was passable with care.</i>
<u>presentable</u>	Fit to be seen. <i>I did my best to make myself look presentable.</i>
<u>respectable</u>	Deserving of esteem and respect. <i>All respectable companies give guarantees.</i>
<u>satisfactory</u>	Meeting requirements. <i>Satisfactory living conditions.</i>
sufferable	Capable of being borne though unpleasant. <i>Sufferable punishment.</i>
<u>sufficient</u>	Of a quantity that can fulfill a need or requirement but without being abundant. <i>Sufficient food.</i>
<u>supportable</u>	Capable of being borne though unpleasant.



Usage Examples of "Tolerable" as an adjective

- *A stimulant to make life more tolerable.*
- *The climate is at least tolerable.*
- *He was fond of music and had a tolerable voice.*

acceptable

Moderately good; satisfactory.

*Some coffee would be most **acceptable**.*

adequate

Having the requisite qualities or resources to meet a task.

*The food was **adequate**.*

allow

Allow or plan for a certain possibility concede the truth or validity of something.

*This short story **allows** of several different interpretations.*

alright

In a satisfactory or adequate manner **alright** is a nonstandard variant of all right.

bear

Be called by (a name or title).

*She is **bearing** his child.*

bearable

Able to be endured.

*Things to make life in the tropics more **bearable**.*

defiant	Showing defiance. <i>A defiant attitude.</i>
endurable	Able to be endured; bearable. <i>My journey was long but endurable.</i>
<u>endure</u>	Persist for a specified period of time. <i>These cities have endured through time.</i>
forbear	Refrain from doing. <i>Rebecca could not forbear a smile.</i>
forbearance	A delay in enforcing rights or claims or privileges; refraining from acting. <i>His unfailing courtesy and forbearance under great provocation.</i>
generous	Not petty in character and mind. <i>A generous helping of pasta.</i>
incombustible	(especially of a building material or component) consisting or made of material that does not burn if exposed to fire. <i>An incombustible floor construction.</i>
largesse	Money or gifts given generously. <i>The distribution of largesse to the local population.</i>
<u>leniency</u>	Lightening a penalty or excusing from a chore by judges or parents or teachers. <i>The court could show leniency.</i>
nonflammable	Impossible to ignite.
okay	In a satisfactory or adequate manner; ('alright' is a nonstandard variant of 'all right'). <i>She'll do okay on her own.</i>
passable	(of a route or road) clear of obstacles and able to be travelled on. <i>The road was passable with care.</i>
patience	Any of various forms of card game for one player, the object of which is to use up all one's cards by forming particular arrangements and sequences. <i>I have run out of patience with her.</i>
patient	Able to accept or tolerate delays, problems, or suffering without becoming annoyed or anxious. <i>A patient smile.</i>
penicillin	A blue mould of a type that produces penicillin. <i>Penicillins and cephalosporins.</i>
permissible	That may be permitted especially as according to rule. <i>Permissible behavior in school.</i>

resistant

Able to tolerate environmental conditions or physiological stress.

*Plastic highly **resistant** to steam and water.*

satisfactory

Giving satisfaction.

*The step makes a **satisfactory** seat.*

stand

Be standing be upright.

*Small stable boats that could **stand** the punishment of heavy seas.*

sufferance

A disposition to tolerate or accept people or situations.

*Charles was only here on **sufferance**.*

tolerance

A disposition to allow freedom of choice and behavior.

*The body's **tolerance** to Ecstasy builds up very quickly.*

toleration

The practice of tolerating something, in particular differences of opinion or behaviour.

*All people should practice **toleration** and live together in peace.*

unobjectionable

Not objectionable; acceptable.

*The bail conditions were **unobjectionable** as far as he was concerned.*

yes

An affirmative.

*I was hoping for a **yes**.*
