<b>boy</b>	Men who mix socially or who belong to a particular group, team, or profession. <i>A four year old <b>boy</b>.</i>
<b>boyish</b>	Befitting or characteristic of a young boy. <i>A <b>boyish</b> grin.</i>
<b>dad</b>	One's father. <i>His <b>dad</b> was with him.</i>
<b>daughter</b>	A thing personified as a daughter in relation to its origin or source. <i>We are the sons and <b>daughters</b> of Adam.</i>
<b>duckling</b>	A young duck.
<b>father</b>	Appear as or admit that one is the father or originator of. <i>They assumed that I was the <b>father</b> of the child.</i>
<b>gestate</b>	Be pregnant with. <i>Rabbits <b>gestate</b> for approximately twenty eight days.</i>
<b>gestation</b>	The state of being pregnant; the period from conception to birth when a woman carries a developing fetus in her uterus. <i>A thorough and painstaking work which was a long time in <b>gestation</b>.</i>
<b>girl</b>	A person's girlfriend. <i><b>Girls</b> go through puberty earlier than boys.</i>
<b>grandchild</b>	A child of one's son or daughter.
<b>guy</b>	Steady or support with a guy wire or cable. <i>You <b>guys</b> want some coffee.</i>
<b>infantile</b>	Being or befitting or characteristic of an infant. <i><b>Infantile</b> colic.</i>
<b>juvenile</b>	An actor playing a juvenile role. <i><b>Juvenile</b> mortality in whelks.</i>
<b>kid</b>	Young goat. <i>Milk fever usually occurs in heavy milkers shortly after <b>kidding</b>.</i>
<b>lass</b>	A girl or young woman. <i>Village <b>lasses</b>.</i>

<b>mom</b>	Informal terms for a mother. <i>My <b>mom</b> gave us each a slice of pizza.</i>
<b>offspring</b>	The product or result of something. <i>German nationalism was the <b>offspring</b> of military ambition.</i>
<b>orphan</b>	Make a child an orphan. <i>An <b>orphan</b> girl.</i>
<b>parturition</b>	The process of giving birth. <i>The weeks following <b>parturition</b>.</i>
<b>progeny</b>	The immediate descendants of a person. <i>Shorthorn cattle are highly effective in bestowing their characteristics on their <b>progeny</b>.</i>
<b>scion</b>	A descendant of a notable family. <i>A <b>scion</b> of royal stock.</i>
<b>son</b>	Used by an older person as a form of address for a boy or young man. <i>You re on private land <b>son</b>.</i>
<b>stripling</b>	A young man. <i>He s a mere <b>stripling</b>.</i>
<b>teen</b>	Relating to teenagers. <i>They were both in their late <b>teens</b>.</i>
<b>young</b>	Young people collectively. <i>The day is still <b>young</b>.</i>
<b>youngster</b>	A young person of either sex. <i>Tiddler is a British term for <b>youngster</b>.</i>
<b>youth</b>	An early stage in the development of something. <i><b>Youth</b> everywhere rises in revolt.</i>
