beget	Make children. <i>Killings beget more killings.</i>
<u>boy</u>	Men who mix socially or who belong to a particular group, team, or profession. <i>A four year old boy.</i>
boyish	Befitting or characteristic of a young boy. <i>A boyish grin.</i>
dad	One's father. <i>His dad was with him.</i>
<u>daughter</u>	A thing personified as a daughter in relation to its origin or source. <i>We are the sons and daughters of Adam.</i>
duckling	A young duck.
father	Appear as or admit that one is the father or originator of. <i>They assumed that I was the father of the child.</i>
gestate	Be pregnant with. <i>Rabbits gestate for approximately twenty eight days.</i>
gestation	The state of being pregnant; the period from conception to birth when a woman carries a developing fetus in her uterus. <i>A thorough and painstaking work which was a long time in gestation.</i>
<u>girl</u>	A person's girlfriend. <i>Girls go through puberty earlier than boys.</i>
grandchild	A child of one's son or daughter.
<u>guy</u>	Steady or support with a guy wire or cable. <i>You guys want some coffee.</i>
infantile	Being or befitting or characteristic of an infant. <i>Infantile colic.</i>
<u>juvenile</u>	An actor playing a juvenile role. <i>Juvenile mortality in whelks.</i>
kid	Young goat. <i>Milk fever usually occurs in heavy milkers shortly after kidding.</i>
lass	A girl or young woman. <i>Village lasses.</i>

mom	Informal terms for a mother. <i>My mom gave us each a slice of pizza.</i>
offspring	The product or result of something. <i>German nationalism was the offspring of military ambition.</i>
orphan	Make a child an orphan. <i>An orphan girl.</i>
parturition	The process of giving birth. <i>The weeks following parturition.</i>
progeny	The immediate descendants of a person. <i>Shorthorn cattle are highly effective in bestowing their characteristics on their progeny.</i>
scion	A descendant of a notable family. <i>A scion of royal stock.</i>
son	Used by an older person as a form of address for a boy or young man. <i>You re on private land son.</i>
stripling	A young man. <i>He s a mere stripling.</i>
teen	Relating to teenagers. <i>They were both in their late teens.</i>
young	Young people collectively. <i>The day is still young.</i>
youngster	A young person of either sex. <i>Tiddler is a British term for youngster.</i>
youth	An early stage in the development of something. <i>Youth everywhere rises in revolt.</i>
