Foolish or senseless behavior. foolery

We endured his **foolery** all afternoon.

fooling A person who is gullible and easy to take advantage of.

Lack of good sense or judgement; stupidity. foolishness

Adjusting to an insane society is total **foolishness**.

Rowdy or boisterous play. horseplay

This ridiculous **horseplay** has gone far enough.

silliness He spouted the same **silliness**es I hear all too often.

Behaviour that shows a lack of good sense or judgement. **stupidity** 


A comedy of infantile **stupidity**.
