afternoon	In the afternoon every afternoon. <i>I telephoned this afternoon.</i>
bedtime	The usual time when someone goes to bed. <i>A bedtime story.</i>
dawn	Become light. <i>Thursday dawned bright and sunny.</i>
day	The part of a day spent working. <i>Every dog has his day.</i>
daybreak	The time in the morning when daylight first appears; dawn. <i>She set off at daybreak.</i>
evening	An evening characterized by a particular event or activity. <i>It was seven o'clock in the evening.</i>
friday	The sixth day of the week; the fifth working day.
hour	A time specified on the twenty four hour clock. <i>A two hour operation.</i>
january	The first month of the year; begins 10 days after the winter solstice.
late	At or toward an end or late period or stage of development. <i>The train arrived late.</i>
monday	The second day of the week; the first working day.
morning	Every morning. <i>The morning papers.</i>
night	A shortening of nightfall. <i>A line of watchfires stretched away into the night.</i>
nightfall	The onset of night; dusk. <i>We had to get back by nightfall.</i>
noon	Twelve o'clock in the day; midday. <i>The service starts at twelve noon.</i>

now	At the present moment. <i>We now rarely see horse drawn vehicles on city streets.</i>
o'clock	According to the clock.
recently	In the recent past. <i>Until recently we had a female doctor.</i>
saturday	The seventh and last day of the week; observed as the Sabbath by Jews and some Christians.
sunday	United States evangelist (1862-1935).
<u>sunrise</u>	The first light of day. <i>A spectacular sunrise over the summit of the mountain.</i>
thursday	The fifth day of the week; the fourth working day.
timing	A particular point or period of time when something happens. <i>The introduction of new signal timings.</i>
<u>today</u>	In these times- Nancy Mitford. <i>Millions of people in Britain today cannot afford adequate housing.</i>
tuesday	The third day of the week; the second working day.
wake	Be awake be alert be there. <i>Please wake me at 6 AM.</i>
wednesday	The fourth day of the week; the third working day.
<u>week</u>	Hours or days of work in a calendar week. <i>It rained for a week.</i>
weekday	A day of the week other than Sunday or Saturday. <i>The weekday rush hour.</i>
yesterday	In the recent past; only a short time ago. <i>Yesterday s solutions are not good enough.</i>
