<a href="#">acme</a>	The point at which something is at its best or most highly developed. <i>Physics is the <b>acme</b> of scientific knowledge.</i>
<b>altitude</b>	Angular distance above the horizon (especially of a celestial object). <i>The mechanism can freeze at <b>altitude</b>.</i>
<a href="#">apex</a>	The highest point in a plane or solid figure, relative to a base line or plane. <i>The central bank is at the <b>apex</b> of the financial system.</i>
<b>apical</b>	(of a consonant) formed with the tip of the tongue at or near the front teeth or the alveolar ridge, for example th or trilled r.
<b>apogee</b>	Apoapsis in Earth orbit; the point in its orbit where a satellite is at the greatest distance from the Earth. <i>A film which was the <b>apogee</b> of German expressionist cinema.</i>
<b>climactic</b>	Consisting of or causing a climax. <i>The film s <b>climactic</b> scenes.</i>
<b>crest</b>	The top line of a hill, mountain, or wave. <i>The swell begins to curl and <b>crest</b>.</i>
<b>elevated</b>	Of high moral or intellectual value elevated in nature or style. <i>This hotel has an <b>elevated</b> position above the village.</i>
<a href="#">elevation</a>	The ability of a dancer to attain height in jumps. <i>As every gunner knows increasing the <b>elevation</b> beyond five degrees can be a risky business.</i>
<b>ladder</b>	With reference to tights or stockings develop or cause to develop a ladder. <i>He climbed the career <b>ladder</b>.</i>
<b>lid</b>	An eyelid. <i>A dustbin <b>lid</b>.</i>
<a href="#">lofty</a>	Having or displaying great dignity or nobility. <i>An extraordinary mixture of harsh reality and <b>lofty</b> ideals.</i>

<b><u>maximum</u></b>	A maximum permitted custodial sentence for an offence. <i>The school takes a <b>maximum</b> of 32 pupils.</i>
<b>meridian</b>	Relating to or situated at a meridian. <i>The European Broadcasting Area extends from the Atlantic to the <b>meridian</b> 40 E.</i>
<b>minaret</b>	Slender tower with balconies.
<b>nadir</b>	The point below the observer that is directly opposite the zenith on the imaginary sphere against which celestial bodies appear to be projected. <i>Asking that question was the <b>nadir</b> of my career.</i>
<b><u>peak</u></b>	Referring to the point at which the specified thing is at its highest level of popularity. <i>Traffic speeds are reduced at <b>peak</b> hours.</i>
<b><u>pinnacle</u></b>	Summit with a pinnacle. <i>Catapulted Einstein to the <b>pinnacle</b> of fame.</i>
<b><u>plateau</u></b>	A relatively flat highland. <i>The peace process had reached a <b>plateau</b>.</i>
<b><u>proliferation</u></b>	A rapid increase in number (especially a rapid increase in the number of deadly weapons). <i>Stress levels are high forcing upon them a <b>proliferation</b> of ailments.</i>
<b>raised</b>	Embellished with a raised pattern created by pressure or embroidery. <i><b>Raised</b> needlework.</i>
<b>rung</b>	A horizontal support on a ladder for a person's foot. <i>We must ensure that the low skilled do not get trapped on the bottom <b>rung</b>.</i>
<b><u>summit</u></b>	Reach the summit of a mountain. <i>They started climbing at 3 45 a m and <b>summitted</b> at 8 45 p m.</i>
<b>superlative</b>	The superlative form of an adjective or adverb. <i>Most surely is the <b>superlative</b> of the adverb surely.</i>
<b>towering</b>	Of great intensity. <i>A majestic <b>towering</b> album.</i>
<b>turret</b>	A low armoured tower, typically one that revolves, for a gun and gunners in a ship, aircraft, fort, or tank. <i>A castle with fairy tale <b>turrets</b>.</i>
<b><u>unsurpassed</u></b>	Better or greater than any other. <i>The quality of workmanship is <b>unsurpassed</b>.</i>
<b><u>upper</u></b>	Denoting a younger (and hence usually shallower) part of a stratigraphic division or archaeological deposit or the period in which it was formed or deposited. <i>The <b>upper</b> stories.</i>

**uppermost** Highest in place, rank, or importance.  
*The **uppermost** book in the pile.*

**zenith** The time at which something is most powerful or successful.  
*In 1977 punk was at its **zenith**.*
