acme	The point at which something is at its best or most highly developed. <i>Physics is the acme of scientific knowledge.</i>
altitude	Angular distance above the horizon (especially of a celestial object). <i>The mechanism can freeze at altitude.</i>
apex	The highest point in a plane or solid figure, relative to a base line or plane. <i>The central bank is at the apex of the financial system.</i>
apical	(of a consonant) formed with the tip of the tongue at or near the front teeth or the alveolar ridge, for example th or trilled r.
apogee	Apoapsis in Earth orbit; the point in its orbit where a satellite is at the greatest distance from the Earth. <i>A film which was the apogee of German expressionist cinema.</i>
climactic	Consisting of or causing a climax. <i>The film s climactic scenes.</i>
crest	The top line of a hill, mountain, or wave. <i>The swell begins to curl and crest.</i>
elevated	Of high moral or intellectual value elevated in nature or style. <i>This hotel has an elevated position above the village.</i>
elevation	The ability of a dancer to attain height in jumps. <i>As every gunner knows increasing the elevation beyond five degrees can be a risky business.</i>
ladder	With reference to tights or stockings develop or cause to develop a ladder. <i>He climbed the career ladder.</i>
lid	An eyelid. <i>A dustbin lid.</i>
lofty	Having or displaying great dignity or nobility. <i>An extraordinary mixture of harsh reality and lofty ideals.</i>

maximum	A maximum permitted custodial sentence for an offence. <i>The school takes a maximum of 32 pupils.</i>
meridian	Relating to or situated at a meridian. <i>The European Broadcasting Area extends from the Atlantic to the meridian 40 E.</i>
minaret	Slender tower with balconies.
nadir	The point below the observer that is directly opposite the zenith on the imaginary sphere against which celestial bodies appear to be projected. <i>Asking that question was the nadir of my career.</i>
peak	Referring to the point at which the specified thing is at its highest level of popularity. <i>Traffic speeds are reduced at peak hours.</i>
pinnacle	Summit with a pinnacle. <i>Catapulted Einstein to the pinnacle of fame.</i>
plateau	A relatively flat highland. <i>The peace process had reached a plateau.</i>
proliferation	A rapid increase in number (especially a rapid increase in the number of deadly weapons). <i>Stress levels are high forcing upon them a proliferation of ailments.</i>
raised	Embellished with a raised pattern created by pressure or embroidery. <i>Raised needlework.</i>
rung	A horizontal support on a ladder for a person's foot. <i>We must ensure that the low skilled do not get trapped on the bottom rung.</i>
summit	Reach the summit of a mountain. <i>They started climbing at 3 45 a m and summitted at 8 45 p m.</i>
superlative	The superlative form of an adjective or adverb. <i>Most surely is the superlative of the adverb surely.</i>
towering	Of great intensity. <i>A majestic towering album.</i>
turret	A low armoured tower, typically one that revolves, for a gun and gunners in a ship, aircraft, fort, or tank. <i>A castle with fairy tale turrets.</i>
unsurpassed	Better or greater than any other. <i>The quality of workmanship is unsurpassed.</i>
upper	Denoting a younger (and hence usually shallower) part of a stratigraphic division or archaeological deposit or the period in which it was formed or deposited. <i>The upper stories.</i>

uppermost Highest in place, rank, or importance.
*The **uppermost** book in the pile.*

zenith The time at which something is most powerful or successful.
*In 1977 punk was at its **zenith**.*
