<b>african</b>	A native or inhabitant of Africa.
<b>beach</b>	Run or haul up a boat or ship on to a beach. <i>He managed to <b>beach</b> a fine trout.</i>
<b>biodiversity</b>	The diversity of plant and animal life in a particular habitat (or in the world as a whole). <i>A high level of <b>biodiversity</b> is desirable.</i>
<b>boundary</b>	A line determining the limits of an area. <i>A county <b>boundary</b>.</i>
<b>coast</b>	The Pacific coast of North America. <i>The <b>coast</b> is clear.</i>
<b>continent</b>	Any of the world's main continuous expanses of land (Europe, Asia, Africa, North and South America, Australia, Antarctica). <i>Pioneers had to cross the <b>continent</b> on foot.</i>
<b>foreshore</b>	The part of the seashore between the highwater mark and the low-water mark.
<b>geology</b>	A science that deals with the history of the earth as recorded in rocks. <i>The <b>geology</b> of the Outer Hebrides.</i>
<b>island</b>	A thing regarded as resembling an island especially in being isolated detached or surrounded in some way. <i>This <b>island</b> nation.</i>
<b>isle</b>	An island or peninsula, especially a small one. <i>Crusoe s fabled <b>isle</b>.</i>
<b>land</b>	Put someone or something on land from a boat. <i>A fly <b>landed</b> on Tom s nose.</i>
<b>layer</b>	Arrange in a layer or layers. <i>They can be increased from cuttings and <b>layers</b>.</i>
<b>marine</b>	Relating to or found in the sea. <i><b>Marine</b> plants and animals such as seaweed and whales.</i>
<b>nature</b>	The natural physical world including plants and animals and landscapes etc. <i>It is impossible to change the laws of <b>nature</b>.</i>
<b>ocean</b>	A very large expanse or quantity. <i>They scramble across the beach to the <b>ocean</b> and plunge into the surf.</i>
<b>offshore</b>	Towards the sea from the land. <i><b>Offshore</b> politics.</i>
<b>outrigger</b>	A boat fitted with an outrigger.

<b>outside</b>	Leading to or from the outside. <i>Anne put the <b>outside</b> lights on.</i>
<b>peninsula</b>	A piece of land almost surrounded by water or projecting out into a body of water.
<b>sea</b>	Used to refer to waves as opposed to calm sea. <i>A <b>sea</b> view.</i>
<b>seabed</b>	The ground under the sea; the ocean floor.
<b>shell</b>	Remove the shell or pod from a nut or seed. <i>Several villages north of the security zone were <b>shelled</b>.</i>
<b>soil</b>	Make soiled filthy or dirty. <i>Good agricultural <b>soil</b>.</i>
<b>stratigraphy</b>	The branch of geology concerned with the order and relative position of strata and their relationship to the geological timescale. <i>You can find materials at the surface which are samples from the deeper <b>stratigraphy</b>.</i>
<b>surface</b>	Relating to or found on the surface of something. <i>They skimmed over the <b>surface</b> of the water.</i>
<b>topsoil</b>	The top layer of soil. <i>Keep all the <b>topsoil</b> you remove you re bound to find a use for it later.</i>
<b>underwater</b>	Growing or remaining under water. <i>They learn to navigate <b>underwater</b> at night.</i>
<b>undulation</b>	A movement up and down or back and forth. <i>The soft <b>undulation</b> of the waves animates the scene.</i>
<b>waterfront</b>	The area of a city (such as a harbor or dockyard) alongside a body of water. <i>Liverpool s <b>waterfront</b>.</i>
<b>wave</b>	Set waves in. <i>She <b>waved</b> him goodbye.</i>
