mangled Having edges that are jagged from injury.






Usage Examples of "Torn" as an adjective

brow An eyebrow.

His **brow**s lifted in surprise.

cleave Split (a molecule) by breaking a particular chemical bond.

The water is going to **cleave** a channel into the rock.

Bring into a particular state by crying.

A cry of rage.

crying Shedding tears.

A **crying** need.

divide (of a number) be contained in a number without a remainder.

He was **sweat**ing profusely.

A fit or period of weeping. weep

Sit down and have a **weep**.

Of a horse make a whinny. whinny
