Torn as an Adjective

Definitions of "Torn" as an adjective

According to the [Oxford Dictionary of English](#), “torn” as an adjective can have the following definitions:

- *Disrupted by the pull of contrary forces.*
- *Having edges that are jagged from injury.*



Synonyms of "Torn" as an adjective (3 Words)

lacerate Having edges that are jagged from injury.
Lacerate leaves.

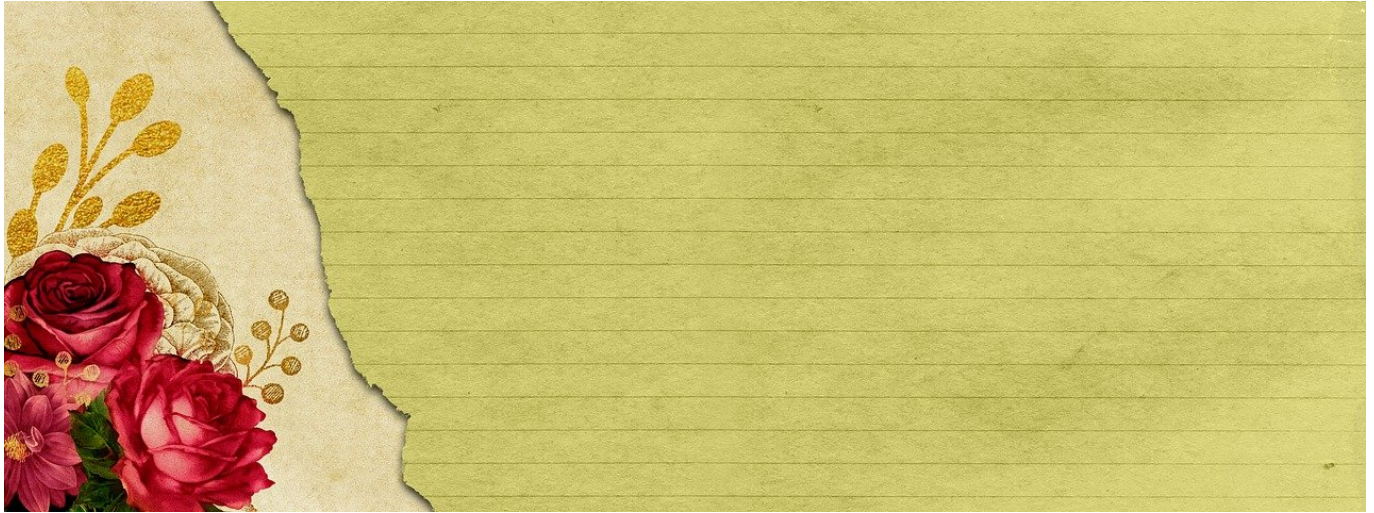
lacerated (of flesh or skin) torn or deeply cut.
He suffered a lacerated hand and arm.

mangled Having edges that are jagged from injury.

Associations of "Torn" (30 Words)

brow	An eyebrow. <i>His brows lifted in surprise.</i>
cleave	Split (a molecule) by breaking a particular chemical bond. <i>The water is going to cleave a channel into the rock.</i>
cry	Bring into a particular state by crying. <i>A cry of rage.</i>
crying	Shedding tears. <i>A crying need.</i>
divide	(of a number) be contained in a number without a remainder. <i>Symbolically the difference of sex is a divide.</i>
fluid	A substance that is fluid at room temperature and pressure. <i>Liquid or fluid assets.</i>
gland	A structure resembling a gland especially a lymph node. <i>Symptoms include swollen glands.</i>
lacerate	Deeply hurt the feelings of; distress. <i>Lacerate leaves.</i>
lachrymal	Concerned with the secretion of tears. <i>That hysterical then lachrymal then guilt ridden hour.</i>
lachrymose	Tearful or given to weeping. <i>A lachrymose children s classic.</i>
lavatory	A room, building, or cubicle containing a toilet or toilets. <i>She flushed the lavatory.</i>

mourn	Observe the customs of mourning after the death of a loved one. <i>She is mourning her dead child.</i>
perspiration	The process of sweating. <i>Perspiration ran down his forehead.</i>
perspire	Excrete perspiration through the pores in the skin. <i>Will was perspiring heavily.</i>
purification	The process of making something spiritually or ceremonially clean. <i>The goal of the religious fast is purification of the soul.</i>
rend	Cause great emotional pain to. <i>Snapping teeth that would rend human flesh to shreds.</i>
rip	The act of rending or ripping or splitting something. <i>The skirt of her frock ripped.</i>
rive	Split or crack (wood or stone). <i>He was riven with guilt.</i>
secrete	(of a cell, gland, or organ) produce and discharge (a substance). <i>Secrete digestive juices.</i>
secretion	A substance discharged by secretion. <i>Hormonal secretions.</i>
seep	A place where petroleum or water oozes slowly out of the ground. <i>Water began to seep through the soles of his boots.</i>
sever	Put an end to (a connection or relationship); break off. <i>Sever a relationship.</i>
sniffle	A head cold causing a running nose and sniffing. <i>He was restraining his sniffles rather well.</i>
soluble	(of a problem) able to be solved. <i>The poison is soluble in alcohol.</i>
spew	Be poured or forced out in large quantities. <i>Buses were spewing out black clouds of exhaust.</i>
split	A split osier used in basketwork. <i>My friend and I split up.</i>
sweat	Get rid of something from the body by exuding sweat. <i>He was sweating profusely.</i>
weep	A fit or period of weeping. <i>Sit down and have a weep.</i>
whinny	Of a horse make a whinny. <i>The pony whinnied and tossed his head happily.</i>
