### **Definitions of "Torn" as an adjective**

According to the [Oxford Dictionary of English](#), “torn” as an adjective can have the following definitions:

- *Disrupted by the pull of contrary forces.*
- *Having edges that are jagged from injury.*



### Synonyms of "Torn" as an adjective (3 Words)

**lacerate** Having edges that are jagged from injury.  
***Lacerate** leaves.*

**lacerated** (of flesh or skin) torn or deeply cut.  
*He suffered a **lacerated** hand and arm.*

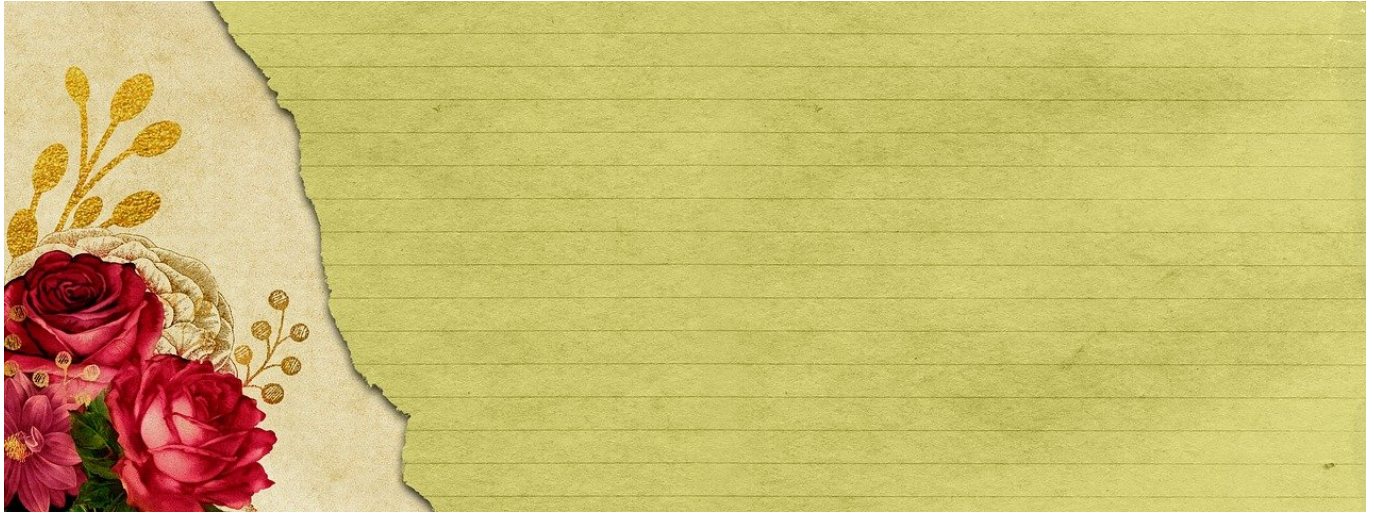
**mangled** Having edges that are jagged from injury.

## Associations of "Torn" (30 Words)

<b>brow</b>	An eyebrow. <i>His <b>brows</b> lifted in surprise.</i>
<b>cleave</b>	Split (a molecule) by breaking a particular chemical bond. <i>The water is going to <b>cleave</b> a channel into the rock.</i>
<b>cry</b>	Bring into a particular state by crying. <i>A <b>cry</b> of rage.</i>
<b>crying</b>	Shedding tears. <i>A <b>crying</b> need.</i>
<b><u>divide</u></b>	(of a number) be contained in a number without a remainder. <i>Symbolically the difference of sex is a <b>divide</b>.</i>
<b><u>fluid</u></b>	A substance that is fluid at room temperature and pressure. <i>Liquid or <b>fluid</b> assets.</i>
<b>gland</b>	A structure resembling a gland especially a lymph node. <i>Symptoms include swollen <b>glands</b>.</i>
<b>lacerate</b>	Deeply hurt the feelings of; distress. <i><b>Lacerate</b> leaves.</i>
<b>lachrymal</b>	Concerned with the secretion of tears. <i>That hysterical then <b>lachrymal</b> then guilt ridden hour.</i>
<b>lachrymose</b>	Tearful or given to weeping. <i>A <b>lachrymose</b> children s classic.</i>
<b>lavatory</b>	A room, building, or cubicle containing a toilet or toilets. <i>She flushed the <b>lavatory</b>.</i>

<b><u>mourn</u></b>	Observe the customs of mourning after the death of a loved one. <i>She is <b>mourning</b> her dead child.</i>
<b>perspiration</b>	The process of sweating. <i><b>Perspiration</b> ran down his forehead.</i>
<b>perspire</b>	Excrete perspiration through the pores in the skin. <i>Will was perspiring heavily.</i>
<b>purification</b>	The process of making something spiritually or ceremonially clean. <i>The goal of the religious fast is <b>purification</b> of the soul.</i>
<b>rend</b>	Cause great emotional pain to. <i>Snapping teeth that would <b>rend</b> human flesh to shreds.</i>
<b>rip</b>	The act of rending or ripping or splitting something. <i>The skirt of her frock <b>ripped</b>.</i>
<b>rive</b>	Split or crack (wood or stone). <i>He was <b>riven</b> with guilt.</i>
<b><u>secrete</u></b>	(of a cell, gland, or organ) produce and discharge (a substance). <i><b>Secrete</b> digestive juices.</i>
<b>secretion</b>	A substance discharged by secretion. <i>Hormonal <b>secretions</b>.</i>
<b><u>seep</u></b>	A place where petroleum or water oozes slowly out of the ground. <i>Water began to <b>seep</b> through the soles of his boots.</i>
<b><u>sever</u></b>	Put an end to (a connection or relationship); break off. <i><b>Sever</b> a relationship.</i>
<b>sniffle</b>	A head cold causing a running nose and sniffing. <i>He was restraining his <b>sniffles</b> rather well.</i>
<b>soluble</b>	(of a problem) able to be solved. <i>The poison is <b>soluble</b> in alcohol.</i>
<b><u>spew</u></b>	Be poured or forced out in large quantities. <i>Buses were <b>spewing</b> out black clouds of exhaust.</i>
<b><u>split</u></b>	A split osier used in basketwork. <i>My friend and I <b>split</b> up.</i>
<b>sweat</b>	Get rid of something from the body by exuding sweat. <i>He was <b>sweating</b> profusely.</i>
<b><u>weep</u></b>	A fit or period of weeping. <i>Sit down and have a <b>weep</b>.</i>
<b>whinny</b>	Of a horse make a whinny. <i>The pony whinnied and tossed his head happily.</i>
