racking Causing great physical or mental suffering.

searing Having lost all moisture.

The **searing** heat of the sun.

Keenly and painfully felt as if caused by a sharp edge or point.

sharpA pencil with a **sharp** point.

shooting Moving or growing quickly.


Shooting beams of light played over the sea.

callus Cause a callus to form on.

cultivator A person or thing that cultivates something.
