keen (of a smell, light, or sound) penetrating; clear.

I have **keen** eyesight.

penetrating Having or demonstrating ability to recognize or draw fine distinctions.

A **penetrating** odor.

(of a sound) extremely high or loud.

piercingThe **piercing** cold of winter.

racking Causing great physical or mental suffering.

searing Having lost all moisture.

The **searing** heat of the sun.

Keenly and painfully felt as if caused by a sharp edge or point.

sharpA pencil with a **sharp** point.

shooting Moving or growing quickly.


Shooting beams of light played over the sea.

Causing physical or especially psychological injury.

stabbing A **stabbing** pain.

A dull persistent (usually moderately intense) pain. aching

Causing great physical or mental pain. **agonizing**

Causing a sharply painful or stinging sensation; used especially of cold. biting

His **biting** satire on corruption and power.

Alcohol flavoured with bitter plant extracts used as an additive in cocktails

or as a medicinal substance to promote appetite or digestion. bitter

It was **bitter**ly cold.

Cause a callus to form on. callus

His foot **callus**ed.



A person or thing that cultivates something. cultivator

Rotary **cultivator**s are ideal in the kitchen garden.

Having extremely unfortunate or dire consequences; bringing ruin. disastrous

United made a **disastrous** start to the season.

Causing anxiety, sorrow or pain; upsetting. distressing Some very **distressing** news.

Filled with or evoking sadness.

doleful He could be struck off with **doleful** consequences.

Showing sorrow. dolorous

A **dolorous** and repetitive tale of atrocity.

Intensely painful.

excruciating He explained the procedure in **excruciating** detail.

Causing annoyance or upset because of an inability to change or achieve

something. **frustrating**

It can be very **frustrating** to find that the size you want isn t there.

(of something bad) very severe or serious.

grievous A grievous loss.

Extremely painful.

harrowing A **harrowing** film about racism and violence.

Very unpleasant. horrible

The tea tasted **horrible**.

So lacking in interest as to cause mental weariness. irksome What an **irksome** task the writing of long letters is.

(of circumstances or conditions) very bad; deplorable. lamentable

The industry is in a **lamentable** state.

Expressing sorrow. mournful

Stared with **mournful** eyes.

Exceptionally bad or displeasing. painful

Their attempts at reggae are **painful**.

Sounding sad and mournful. **plaintive** A plaintive cry.

Keenly distressing to the mind or feelings. **poignant**

The **poignant** scent of her powder.

Of things that make you feel sad Christina Rossetti.

sad Better by far that you should forget and smile Than that you should

remember and be **sad**.



sore Suffering pain from a part of one's body.

We re in **sore** need of him.

sorrowful Feeling or showing grief.

Sorrowful news.

stressful Extremely irritating to the nerves. *The stressful days before a war.*

Characteristic of false pride; having an exaggerated sense of self-

swollen importance.

So **swollen** by victory that he was unfit for normal duty.

tine Prong on a fork or pitchfork or antler.

A boring or socially inept person, typically having an obsessive and solitary

<u>tragic</u> interest.

Tragic hero.

traumatic Deeply disturbing or distressing.

She is remembering some deeply traumatic incident in her past.

Extremely irritating to the nerves.

tryingA trying day at the office.
