The condition of being filled to capacity.

The honesty and **fullness** of the information they provide.

The practice or policy of providing equal access to opportunities and

resources for people who might otherwise be excluded or

**inclusiveness** marginalized, such as those having physical or mental disabilities or

belonging to other minority groups.

The most useful feature of the book is probably its **inclusiveness**.

**integrality** The state of being total and complete.

The final aggregate.

The **sum** of all our troubles did not equal the misery they suffered.

**sum total** A set containing all and only the members of two or more given sets.

The whole amount.

total

He scored a **total** of thirty three points.

Each of the three dramatic principles requiring limitation of the supposed time of a drama to that occupied in acting it or to a single day unity of time use of one scene throughout unity of place and concentration on the development of a single plot unity of action.

They speak of the three parts as a **unity**.

whole An assemblage of parts that is regarded as a single entity.

wholeness Good physical or mental health.
