## Town as a Noun

### Definitions of "Town" as a noun

According to the [Oxford Dictionary of English](#), “town” as a noun can have the following definitions:

- *A built-up area with a name, defined boundaries, and local government, that is larger than a village and generally smaller than a city.*
- *The particular town under consideration, especially one's own town.*
- *The central part of a neighbourhood, with its business or shopping area.*
- *The permanent residents of a university town.*
- *The people living in a municipality smaller than a city.*
- *An urban area with a fixed boundary that is smaller than a city.*
- *An administrative division of a county.*
- *The chief city or town of a region.*
- *United States architect who was noted for his design and construction of truss bridges (1784-1844).*
- *Densely populated areas, especially as contrasted with the country or suburbs.*

- borough** An administrative division of London.
- conurbation** An aggregation or continuous network of urban communities.  
*The major **conurbations** of London and Birmingham.*
- ithiel town** United States architect who was noted for his design and construction of truss bridges (1784-1844).

- settlement** The process of establishing a settlement or settlements.  
*They finally reached a **settlement** with the union.*
- townsfolk** The people living in a municipality smaller than a city.
- township** A division of a county with some corporate powers.

- townspeople** The people living in a particular town or city.

## Associations of "Town" (30 Words)

<b>borough</b>	An English town that forms the constituency of a member of parliament.
<b>capital</b>	Uppercase. A <b>capital</b> idea.
<b>city</b>	A town created a city by charter and usually containing a cathedral. The <b>city</b> voted for Republicans in 1994.
<b>community</b>	A group of nations having common interests. The sense of <b>community</b> that organized religion can provide.
<b>constituency</b>	The body of voters who elect a representative for their area. A parliamentary candidate in the Hampstead and Highgate <b>constituency</b> .
<b>county</b>	Relating to or characteristic of aristocratic people with an ancestral home in a particular county. The <b>county</b> plans to build a new road.
<b>depopulate</b>	Reduce in population. The epidemic <b>depopulated</b> the countryside.
<b>district</b>	Divide into areas. An elegant shopping <b>district</b> .

<b><u>domestic</u></b>	Converted or adapted to domestic use. <i>Everything sounded very peaceful and <b>domestic</b>.</i>
<b><u>ghetto</u></b>	The Jewish quarter in a city. <i>The relative security of the gay <b>ghetto</b>.</i>
<b>hamlet</b>	A community of people smaller than a village.
<b>hovel</b>	An open shed or outhouse, used for sheltering cattle or storing grain or tools. <i>People were living in rat infested <b>hovels</b>.</i>
<b><u>local</u></b>	A local train or bus service. <i>The village has an excellent <b>local</b> bus service.</i>
<b>locality</b>	An area or neighbourhood. <i>The rock s size and <b>locality</b>.</i>
<b>metropolitan</b>	Relating to or denoting a metropolitan or his see. <i>A sophisticated <b>metropolitan</b>.</i>
<b>municipal</b>	Of or relating to the government of a municipality J L kuntz. <i>International law only authorizes a belligerent to punish a spy under its <b>municipal</b> law.</i>
<b>municipality</b>	The governing body of a municipality. <i>Voters in each <b>municipality</b> choose between four candidates.</i>
<b><u>neighborhood</u></b>	A surrounding or nearby region. <i>He always blames someone else in the immediate <b>neighborhood</b>.</i>
<b>outskirts</b>	Outlying areas (as of a city or town). <i>They mingled in the <b>outskirts</b> of the crowd.</i>
<b>parish</b>	(in the Christian Church) a small administrative district typically having its own church and a priest or pastor. <i>A <b>parish</b> councillor.</i>
<b>populous</b>	Having a large population; densely populated. <i>The <b>populous</b> city of Shanghai.</i>
<b>prefecture</b>	A prefect's office or tenure. <i>Enraged fans besieged the <b>Prefecture</b> of Police.</i>
<b><u>province</u></b>	The territory occupied by one of the constituent administrative districts of a nation. <i>It was his <b>province</b> to take care of himself.</i>
<b><u>rural</u></b>	In, relating to, or characteristic of the countryside rather than the town. <i>Remote <b>rural</b> areas.</i>
<b><u>rustic</u></b>	Made of untrimmed branches or rough timber. <i>A <b>rustic</b> bridge.</i>

- slum** Put up with conditions that are less comfortable or of a lower quality than one is used to.  
*The area was fast becoming a **slum** for the destitute.*
- subdivide** Form into subdivisions.  
*The cells **subdivided**.*
- suburban** Relating to or characteristic of or situated in suburbs.  
***Suburban** life.*
- urban** Relating to or concerned with a city or densely populated area.  
***Urban** property owners.*
- village** A self contained district or community within a town or city regarded as having features characteristic of village life.  
*The Olympic **village**.*
