Town as a Noun

Definitions of "Town" as a noun

According to the [Oxford Dictionary of English](#), “town” as a noun can have the following definitions:

- *A built-up area with a name, defined boundaries, and local government, that is larger than a village and generally smaller than a city.*
- *The particular town under consideration, especially one's own town.*
- *The central part of a neighbourhood, with its business or shopping area.*
- *The permanent residents of a university town.*
- *The people living in a municipality smaller than a city.*
- *An urban area with a fixed boundary that is smaller than a city.*
- *An administrative division of a county.*
- *The chief city or town of a region.*
- *United States architect who was noted for his design and construction of truss bridges (1784-1844).*
- *Densely populated areas, especially as contrasted with the country or suburbs.*

- borough** An administrative division of London.
- conurbation** An aggregation or continuous network of urban communities.
*The major **conurbations** of London and Birmingham.*
- ithiel town** United States architect who was noted for his design and construction of truss bridges (1784-1844).

*Voters in each **municipality** choose between four candidates.*
- settlement** The process of establishing a settlement or settlements.
*They finally reached a **settlement** with the union.*
- townsfolk** The people living in a municipality smaller than a city.
- township** A division of a county with some corporate powers.
*A Johannesburg **township**.*
- townspeople** The people living in a particular town or city.

borough	An English town that forms the constituency of a member of parliament.
capital	Uppercase. A capital idea.
city	A town created a city by charter and usually containing a cathedral. The city voted for Republicans in 1994.
community	A group of nations having common interests. The sense of community that organized religion can provide.
constituency	The body of voters who elect a representative for their area. A parliamentary candidate in the Hampstead and Highgate constituency .
county	Relating to or characteristic of aristocratic people with an ancestral home in a particular county. The county plans to build a new road.
depopulate	Reduce in population. The epidemic depopulated the countryside.
district	Divide into areas. An elegant shopping district .

<u>domestic</u>	Converted or adapted to domestic use. <i>Everything sounded very peaceful and domestic.</i>
<u>ghetto</u>	The Jewish quarter in a city. <i>The relative security of the gay ghetto.</i>
hamlet	A community of people smaller than a village.
hovel	An open shed or outhouse, used for sheltering cattle or storing grain or tools. <i>People were living in rat infested hovels.</i>
<u>local</u>	A local train or bus service. <i>The village has an excellent local bus service.</i>
locality	An area or neighbourhood. <i>The rock s size and locality.</i>
metropolitan	Relating to or denoting a metropolitan or his see. <i>A sophisticated metropolitan.</i>
municipal	Of or relating to the government of a municipality J L kuntz. <i>International law only authorizes a belligerent to punish a spy under its municipal law.</i>
municipality	The governing body of a municipality. <i>Voters in each municipality choose between four candidates.</i>
<u>neighborhood</u>	A surrounding or nearby region. <i>He always blames someone else in the immediate neighborhood.</i>
outskirts	Outlying areas (as of a city or town). <i>They mingled in the outskirts of the crowd.</i>
parish	(in the Christian Church) a small administrative district typically having its own church and a priest or pastor. <i>A parish councillor.</i>
populous	Having a large population; densely populated. <i>The populous city of Shanghai.</i>
prefecture	A prefect's office or tenure. <i>Enraged fans besieged the Prefecture of Police.</i>
<u>province</u>	The territory occupied by one of the constituent administrative districts of a nation. <i>It was his province to take care of himself.</i>
<u>rural</u>	In, relating to, or characteristic of the countryside rather than the town. <i>Remote rural areas.</i>
<u>rustic</u>	Made of untrimmed branches or rough timber. <i>A rustic bridge.</i>

- slum** Put up with conditions that are less comfortable or of a lower quality than one is used to.
*The area was fast becoming a **slum** for the destitute.*
- subdivide** Form into subdivisions.
*The cells **subdivided**.*
- suburban** Relating to or characteristic of or situated in suburbs.
***Suburban** life.*
- urban** Relating to or concerned with a city or densely populated area.
***Urban** property owners.*
- village** A self contained district or community within a town or city regarded as having features characteristic of village life.
*The Olympic **village**.*
