- The particular town under consideration, especially one's own town.
- The central part of a neighbourhood, with its business or shopping area.
- The permanent residents of a university town.
- The people living in a municipality smaller than a city.
- An urban area with a fixed boundary that is smaller than a city.
- An administrative division of a county.
- The chief city or town of a region.
- United States architect who was noted for his design and construction of truss bridges (1784-1844.
- Densely populated areas, especially as contrasted with the country or suburbs.
