across	Referring to a crossword answer which reads horizontally. <i>Halfway across Jenny jumped.</i>
along	In addition (usually followed by `with. <i>He continued to plod along.</i>
alphabetical	Relating to or expressed by a writing system that uses an alphabet. <i>Alphabetical characters.</i>
barograph	A recording barometer; automatically records on paper the variations in atmospheric pressure.
chase	A rectangular metal frame used in letterpress printing to hold together the pages or columns of composed type that are printed at one time. <i>The policeman chased the mugger down the alley.</i>
dictation	Speech intended for reproduction in writing. <i>The dictation of letters.</i>
directory	A board in an organization or large store listing names and locations of departments, individuals, etc.
discography	A descriptive catalogue of musical recordings, particularly those of a particular performer or composer. <i>Jazz fans direct their intellectual energy to discography.</i>
disk	Computer science a memory device consisting of a flat disk covered with a magnetic coating on which information is stored. <i>The moon s disk hung in a cloudless sky.</i>
document	Support or accompany with documentation. <i>The photographer spent years documenting the lives of miners.</i>
ensue	Issue or terminate (in a specified way, state, etc.); end. <i>The difficulties which ensued from their commitment to Cuba.</i>
evidential	Of or providing evidence. <i>Evidential signs of a forced entry.</i>

file	Smooth with a file. <i>The students filed into the classroom.</i>
lane	A narrow way or road. <i>The shipping lanes of the South Atlantic.</i>
listing	An entry on an official register of securities accepted for trading and quotation on a stock exchange.
phonograph	Machine in which rotating records cause a stylus to vibrate and the vibrations are amplified acoustically or electronically.
platform	A woman's shoe with a very high thick sole. <i>Seeking election on a platform of low taxes.</i>
railroad	Supply with railroad lines. <i>They know I was railroaded and falsely accused.</i>
railway	A line of track providing a runway for wheels. <i>A railway line.</i>
registration	The series of letters and figures identifying a motor vehicle assigned on registration and displayed on a number plate. <i>In certain cases children may acquire British citizenship through registration.</i>
station	A bus or coach station. <i>The lookout resumed his station in the bow.</i>
stenographer	A person whose job is to transcribe speech in shorthand. <i>A court stenographer.</i>
succeed	Be the successor (of). <i>We succeeded in getting tickets to the show.</i>
syllabus	An integrated course of academic studies. <i>There isn't time to cover the syllabus.</i>
trail	A trailer for a film or broadcast. <i>A recent television trail for The Bill.</i>
transcribe	Write out from speech, notes, etc. <i>The anthropologist transcribed the sentences of the native informant.</i>
transcription	(genetics) the organic process whereby the DNA sequence in a gene is copied into mRNA; the process whereby a base sequence of messenger RNA is synthesized on a template of complementary DNA. <i>Our usual transcription is given in brackets.</i>
transliterate	Write or print (a letter or word) using the closest corresponding letters of a different alphabet or script. <i>The Sanskrit text had to be transliterated.</i>

traverse

An area of land surveyed with a traverse.

*The plaintiff must assert certain facts which if **traversed** he would be put to prove.*

walkway

A passage or path for walking along, especially a raised passageway connecting different sections of a building or a wide path in a park or garden.
