| disk             | Computer science a memory device consisting of a flat disk covered with a magnetic coating on which information is stored. <i>The moon s disk hung in a cloudless sky.</i>  |
| <u>document</u>  | Support or accompany with documentation.<br>The photographer spent years <b>document</b> ing the lives of miners.   |
| <u>ensue</u>     | Issue or terminate (in a specified way, state, etc.); end.<br><i>The difficulties which</i> <b>ensue</b> <i>d from their commitment to Cuba</i> .   |
| evidential       | Of or providing evidence.<br><i>Evidential</i> signs of a forced entry.   |

| listing           | An entry on an official register of securities accepted for trading and quotation on a stock exchange.   |
| phonograph        | Machine in which rotating records cause a stylus to vibrate and the vibrations are amplified acoustically or electronically.   |

| syllabus          | An integrated course of academic studies.<br>There isn t time to cover the <b>syllabus</b> .   |
| <u>trail</u>      | A trailer for a film or broadcast.<br>A recent television <b>trail</b> for The Bill.   |
| <u>transcribe</u> | Write out from speech, notes, etc.<br>The anthropologist <b>transcribe</b> d the sentences of the native informant.  |
| transcription     | (genetics) the organic process whereby the DNA sequence in a gene is<br>copied into mRNA; the process whereby a base sequence of messenger<br>RNA is synthesized on a template of complementary DNA.<br><i>Our usual transcription</i> is given in brackets. |
| transliterate     | Write or print (a letter or word) using the closest corresponding letters of a different alphabet or script. <i>The Sanskrit text had to be transliterated</i> .   |



| <u>traverse</u> | An area of land surveyed with a traverse.<br>The plaintiff must assert certain facts which if <b>traverse</b> d he would be put to<br>prove.        |
