## Associations of "Track record" (30 Words)

<a href="#">across</a>	Referring to a crossword answer which reads horizontally. <i>Halfway <b>across</b> Jenny jumped.</i>
<b>along</b>	In addition (usually followed by `with. <i>He continued to plod <b>along</b>.</i>
<b>alphabetical</b>	Relating to or expressed by a writing system that uses an alphabet. <i><b>Alphabetical</b> characters.</i>
<b>barograph</b>	A recording barometer; automatically records on paper the variations in atmospheric pressure.
<b>chase</b>	A rectangular metal frame used in letterpress printing to hold together the pages or columns of composed type that are printed at one time. <i>The policeman <b>chased</b> the mugger down the alley.</i>
<b>dictation</b>	Speech intended for reproduction in writing. <i>The <b>dictation</b> of letters.</i>
<a href="#">directory</a>	A board in an organization or large store listing names and locations of departments, individuals, etc.
<b>discography</b>	A descriptive catalogue of musical recordings, particularly those of a particular performer or composer. <i>Jazz fans direct their intellectual energy to <b>discography</b>.</i>
<b>disk</b>	Computer science a memory device consisting of a flat disk covered with a magnetic coating on which information is stored. <i>The moon s <b>disk</b> hung in a cloudless sky.</i>
<a href="#">document</a>	Support or accompany with documentation. <i>The photographer spent years <b>documenting</b> the lives of miners.</i>
<a href="#">ensue</a>	Issue or terminate (in a specified way, state, etc.); end. <i>The difficulties which <b>ensued</b> from their commitment to Cuba.</i>
<b>evidential</b>	Of or providing evidence. <i><b>Evidential</b> signs of a forced entry.</i>

<b>file</b>	Smooth with a file. <i>The students <b>filed</b> into the classroom.</i>
<b>lane</b>	A narrow way or road. <i>The shipping <b>lanes</b> of the South Atlantic.</i>
<b>listing</b>	An entry on an official register of securities accepted for trading and quotation on a stock exchange.
<b>phonograph</b>	Machine in which rotating records cause a stylus to vibrate and the vibrations are amplified acoustically or electronically.
<b>platform</b>	A woman's shoe with a very high thick sole. <i>Seeking election on a <b>platform</b> of low taxes.</i>
<b>railroad</b>	Supply with railroad lines. <i>They know I was <b>railroaded</b> and falsely accused.</i>
<b>railway</b>	A line of track providing a runway for wheels. <i>A <b>railway</b> line.</i>
<b>registration</b>	The series of letters and figures identifying a motor vehicle assigned on registration and displayed on a number plate. <i>In certain cases children may acquire British citizenship through <b>registration</b>.</i>
<b>station</b>	A bus or coach station. <i>The lookout resumed his <b>station</b> in the bow.</i>
<b>stenographer</b>	A person whose job is to transcribe speech in shorthand. <i>A court <b>stenographer</b>.</i>
<b>succeed</b>	Be the successor (of). <i>We <b>succeeded</b> in getting tickets to the show.</i>
<b>syllabus</b>	An integrated course of academic studies. <i>There isn't time to cover the <b>syllabus</b>.</i>
<b>trail</b>	A trailer for a film or broadcast. <i>A recent television <b>trail</b> for The Bill.</i>
<b>transcribe</b>	Write out from speech, notes, etc. <i>The anthropologist <b>transcribed</b> the sentences of the native informant.</i>
<b>transcription</b>	(genetics) the organic process whereby the DNA sequence in a gene is copied into mRNA; the process whereby a base sequence of messenger RNA is synthesized on a template of complementary DNA. <i>Our usual <b>transcription</b> is given in brackets.</i>
<b>transliterate</b>	Write or print (a letter or word) using the closest corresponding letters of a different alphabet or script. <i>The Sanskrit text had to be <b>transliterated</b>.</i>

**traverse**

An area of land surveyed with a traverse.

*The plaintiff must assert certain facts which if **traversed** he would be put to prove.*

**walkway**

A passage or path for walking along, especially a raised passageway connecting different sections of a building or a wide path in a park or garden.
