<b><a href="#">across</a></b>	Referring to a crossword answer which reads horizontally. <i>The marble slabs were cut <b>across</b>.</i>
<b>along</b>	With a forward motion. <i>We drove <b>along</b> admiring the view.</i>
<b>chase</b>	Cut a furrow into a columns. <i>The company employs people to <b>chase</b> up debts.</i>
<b>course</b>	A series of changes which brings the bells back to their original order, or the changes of a particular bell. <i>Many of the hares <b>coursed</b> escaped unharmed.</i>
<b>enclosure</b>	The state of being enclosed, especially in a religious community. <i>A deer <b>enclosure</b>.</i>
<b><a href="#">ensue</a></b>	Issue or terminate (in a specified way, state, etc.); end. <i>The difficulties which <b>ensued</b> from their commitment to Cuba.</i>
<b>follow</b>	Follow with the eyes or the mind. <i>If you ve been <b>following</b> me on Facebook recently you may have seen a bunch of different posts about surgery and back trouble.</i>
<b>highway</b>	A major road for any form of motor transport. <i>A six lane <b>highway</b>.</i>
<b>lane</b>	A dark streak or band which shows up against a bright background, especially in a spiral galaxy. <i>A bus <b>lane</b>.</i>
<b>listing</b>	A database containing an ordered array of items (names or topics).
<b>pass</b>	An act of passing the hands over something as in conjuring or hypnotism. <i>The pain eventually <b>passed</b> off.</i>
<b>path</b>	A course of action or way of achieving a specified result. <i>A chosen career <b>path</b>.</i>

<b>platform</b>	The declared policy of a political party or group. <i>The speaker mounted the <b>platform</b>.</i>
<b>pursuit</b>	A cycling race in which competitors set off from different parts of a track and attempt to overtake one another. <i>The cat crouched in the grass in <b>pursuit</b> of a bird.</i>
<u>quest</u>	The act of searching for something. <i>He was a real scientist <b>questing</b> after truth.</i>
<b>racetrack</b>	A course over which races are run.
<b>railroad</b>	Supply with railroad lines. <i><b>Railroad</b> tracks.</i>
<b>railway</b>	A network of tracks with the trains, organization, and personnel required for its working. <i>Services were disrupted after an eight year old boy was spotted trespassing on the <b>railway</b>.</i>
<b>retrace</b>	Reassemble mentally. <i>We <b>retraced</b> the route we took last summer.</i>
<u>road</u>	A railroad. <i>Clara had to walk in the <b>road</b> to avoid black plastic rubbish sacks.</i>
<b>route</b>	Send via a specific route. <i>All lines of communication were <b>routed</b> through London.</i>
<b>speeder</b>	A driver who exceeds the safe speed limit.
<b>stadium</b>	An ancient Roman or Greek measure of length about 185 metres originally the length of a stadium.
<u>station</u>	Assign to a station. <i>A naval <b>station</b>.</i>
<b>succeed</b>	Attain fame, wealth, or social status. <i>We <b>succeeded</b> in getting tickets to the show.</i>
<u>trace</u>	Discover traces of. <i><b>Trace</b> the student s progress.</i>
<u>trail</u>	A trailer for a film or broadcast. <i>The bride s veiled <b>trailed</b> along the ground.</i>
<u>traverse</u>	An area of land surveyed with a traverse. <i>He crept up and threw a grenade over the <b>traverse</b>.</i>
<b>vestige</b>	The smallest amount. <i>The last <b>vestiges</b> of colonialism.</i>
<u>walkway</u>	A passage or path for walking along, especially a raised passageway connecting different sections of a building or a wide path in a park or garden.
