coat of arms	Growth of hair or wool or fur covering the body of an animal.
colophon	A publisher's emblem or imprint, usually on the title page of a book.
crest	A ridge along the surface of a bone. Biopsy specimens of the iliac crest were obtained under local anaesthesia.
device	A piece of portable electronic equipment that can connect to the internet, such as a smartphone, tablet, or laptop computer. <i>He would stoop to any device to win a point.</i>



earmark	A characteristic or identifying feature. This car has all the earmark s of a classic.
<u>emblem</u>	Special design or visual object representing a quality, type, group, etc. <i>America s national emblem the bald eagle.</i>
feature	The principal (full-length) film in a program at a movie theater. They ran a feature on retirement planning.
figure	The property possessed by a sum or total or indefinite quantity of units or individuals. <i>He cut a fine figure</i> .
<u>hallmark</u>	A distinctive feature. The tiny bubbles are the hallmark of fine champagnes.
idiosyncrasy	A distinctive or peculiar feature or characteristic of a place or thing. One of his little idiosyncrasies was always preferring to be in the car first.
insignia	A sign or token of something. The ruins are devoid of moss and ivy the romantic insignia of age and decay.
<u>logo</u>	A symbol or other small design adopted by an organization to identify its products, uniform, vehicles, etc. The Olympic logo was emblazoned across the tracksuits.
logotype	A company emblem or device.
mark	A marking that consists of lines that cross each other. <i>He left an indelible mark on the American theater.</i>
monogram	A motif of two or more interwoven letters, typically a person's initials, used to identify a personal possession or as a logo. <i>A handkerchief with his monogram embroidered on one corner.</i>
motif	A leitmotif or figure. In this opera Verdi used identifying motif s.
peculiarity	A distinguishing trait. His essays characterized decency as a British peculiarity .
<u>penchant</u>	A strong liking. He has a penchant for adopting stray dogs.
<u>proclivity</u>	A tendency to choose or do something regularly; an inclination or predisposition towards a particular thing. <i>He has a proclivity for exaggeration.</i>
quality	An essential and distinguishing attribute of something or someone–Shakespeare. An improvement in product quality .



<u>quirk</u>	A narrow groove beside a beading. Wry humour put a slight quirk in his mouth.
seal	The state or fact of being joined or rendered impervious with a seal. Attach a draught seal to the door itself.
<u>shield</u>	A stylized representation of a shield used for displaying a coat of arms. The horseshoe crab s armour forms a huge domed shield .
sign	A fundamental linguistic unit linking a signifier to that which is signified. A person born under the sign of Virgo.
<u>speciality</u>	A branch of medicine or surgery. His speciality was watercolours.
stamp	A small adhesive piece of paper stuck to something to show that an amount of money has been paid in particular a postage stamp. <i>TV licence stamps.</i>
stylemark	A distinctive characteristic or attribute.
<u>symbol</u>	A mark or character used as a conventional representation of an object, function, or process, e.g. the letter or letters standing for a chemical element or a character in musical notation. <i>The chemical symbol for helium is He.</i>
telltale sign	Someone who gossips indiscreetly.
trait	A genetically determined characteristic. Breeders were installing some trait that allowed the crop to thrive.

<u>hallmark</u>	Stamp with a hallmark. This attitude hallmark s many a Briton s behaviour abroad.
indicator	A board or screen in a railway station, airport, etc. giving current information. <i>The raccoon is a poor choice as an indicator of riparian habitat.</i>
<u>logo</u>	A symbol or other small design adopted by an organization to identify its products, uniform, vehicles, etc. The Olympic logo was emblazoned across the tracksuits.
mascot	A person or animal that is adopted by a team or other group as a symbolic figure. <i>The team s dolphin mascot</i> .
motto	A short sentence or phrase chosen as encapsulating the beliefs or ideals of an individual, family, or institution. The family motto is Faithful though Unfortunate.
placard	Publicize or announce by placards. They were placard ing the town with posters.
projectile	Denoting or relating to a projectile. They tried to shield Johnson from the projectile s that were being thrown.
redesign	The action or process of redesigning something. The front seats have been redesign ed.
represent	Be a delegate or spokesperson for represent somebody s interest or be a proxy or substitute for as of politicians and office holders representing their constituents or of a tenant representing other tenants in a housing dispute. <i>Santos are small wooden figures representing saints.</i>
shibboleth	A custom, principle, or belief distinguishing a particular class or group of people, especially a long-standing one regarded as outmoded or no longer important. <i>Liberal</i> shibboleth s about education.

sign	A person born under the sign of Virgo.
signal	Be a signal for or a symptom of. The diner signal ed the waiters to bring the menu.
<u>signature</u>	A sheet with several pages printed on it it folds to page size and is bound with other signatures to form a book. The chef produced the p t that was his signature .
slogan	A motto associated with a political party or movement or other group. <i>Students were chanting slogans.</i>
<u>symbol</u>	Symbolize. The limousine was another symbol of his wealth and authority.
<u>symbolic</u>	Involving the use of symbols or symbolism. The spinning wheel was as symbolic of colonical Massachusetts as the codfish.
technicolor A trademarked method of making color motion pictures.	
term	Give a descriptive name to call by a specified term. <i>The summer term</i> .
truism	An obvious truth. The truism that you get what you pay for.
zodiac	Astrology a circular diagram representing the 12 zodiacal constellations and showing their signs.
