earmark	A characteristic or identifying feature. <i>This car has all the earmarks of a classic.</i>
<u>emblem</u>	Special design or visual object representing a quality, type, group, etc. <i>America's national emblem the bald eagle.</i>
feature	The principal (full-length) film in a program at a movie theater. <i>They ran a feature on retirement planning.</i>
figure	The property possessed by a sum or total or indefinite quantity of units or individuals. <i>He cut a fine figure.</i>
<u>hallmark</u>	A distinctive feature. <i>The tiny bubbles are the hallmark of fine champagnes.</i>
idiosyncrasy	A distinctive or peculiar feature or characteristic of a place or thing. <i>One of his little idiosyncrasies was always preferring to be in the car first.</i>
insignia	A sign or token of something. <i>The ruins are devoid of moss and ivy the romantic insignia of age and decay.</i>
<u>logo</u>	A symbol or other small design adopted by an organization to identify its products, uniform, vehicles, etc. <i>The Olympic logo was emblazoned across the tracksuits.</i>
logotype	A company emblem or device.
mark	A marking that consists of lines that cross each other. <i>He left an indelible mark on the American theater.</i>
monogram	A motif of two or more interwoven letters, typically a person's initials, used to identify a personal possession or as a logo. <i>A handkerchief with his monogram embroidered on one corner.</i>
<u>motif</u>	A leitmotif or figure. <i>In this opera Verdi used identifying motifs.</i>
peculiarity	A distinguishing trait. <i>His essays characterized decency as a British peculiarity.</i>
<u>penchant</u>	A strong liking. <i>He has a penchant for adopting stray dogs.</i>
<u>proclivity</u>	A tendency to choose or do something regularly; an inclination or predisposition towards a particular thing. <i>He has a proclivity for exaggeration.</i>
quality	An essential and distinguishing attribute of something or someone-Shakespeare. <i>An improvement in product quality.</i>

<u>quirk</u>	A narrow groove beside a beading. <i>Wry humour put a slight quirk in his mouth.</i>
seal	The state or fact of being joined or rendered impervious with a seal. <i>Attach a draught seal to the door itself.</i>
<u>shield</u>	A stylized representation of a shield used for displaying a coat of arms. <i>The horseshoe crab's armour forms a huge domed shield.</i>
sign	A fundamental linguistic unit linking a signifier to that which is signified. <i>A person born under the sign of Virgo.</i>
<u>speciality</u>	A branch of medicine or surgery. <i>His speciality was watercolours.</i>
stamp	A small adhesive piece of paper stuck to something to show that an amount of money has been paid in particular a postage stamp. <i>TV licence stamps.</i>
stylemark	A distinctive characteristic or attribute.
<u>symbol</u>	A mark or character used as a conventional representation of an object, function, or process, e.g. the letter or letters standing for a chemical element or a character in musical notation. <i>The chemical symbol for helium is He.</i>
telltale sign	Someone who gossips indiscreetly.
trait	A genetically determined characteristic. <i>Breeders were installing some trait that allowed the crop to thrive.</i>

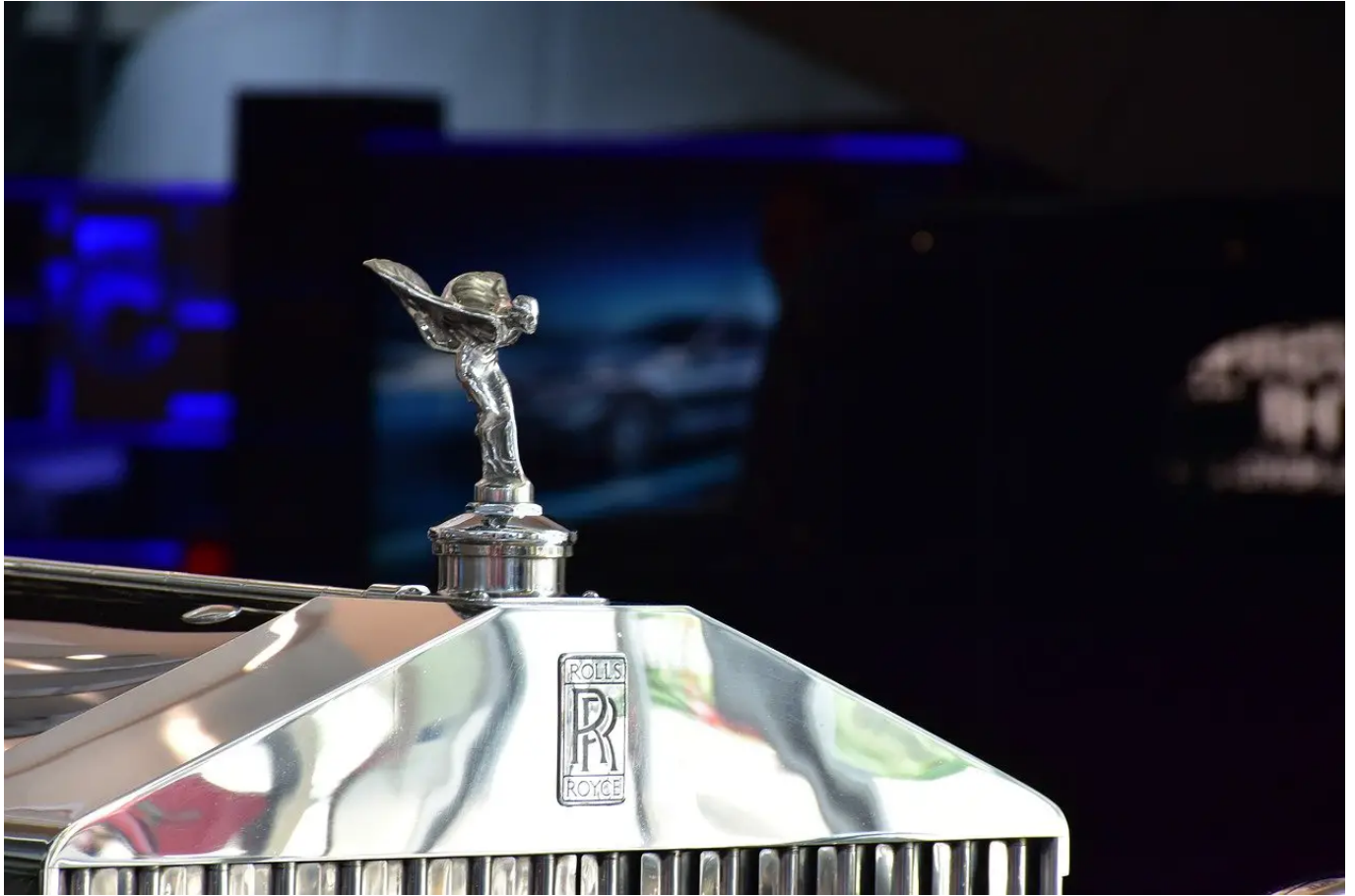
brand To accuse or condemn or openly or formally or brand as disgraceful.

feature	Have as a feature. <i>This restaurant features the most famous chefs in France.</i>
featured	Made a feature or highlight; given prominence. <i>He was the featured guest artist.</i>
hallmark	Stamp with a hallmark. <i>This attitude hallmarks many a Briton s behaviour abroad.</i>
indicator	A board or screen in a railway station, airport, etc. giving current information. <i>The raccoon is a poor choice as an indicator of riparian habitat.</i>
logo	A symbol or other small design adopted by an organization to identify its products, uniform, vehicles, etc. <i>The Olympic logo was emblazoned across the tracksuits.</i>
mascot	A person or animal that is adopted by a team or other group as a symbolic figure. <i>The team s dolphin mascot.</i>
motto	A short sentence or phrase chosen as encapsulating the beliefs or ideals of an individual, family, or institution. <i>The family motto is Faithful though Unfortunate.</i>
placard	Publicize or announce by placards. <i>They were placarding the town with posters.</i>
projectile	Denoting or relating to a projectile. <i>They tried to shield Johnson from the projectiles that were being thrown.</i>
redesign	The action or process of redesigning something. <i>The front seats have been redesigned.</i>
represent	Be a delegate or spokesperson for represent somebody s interest or be a proxy or substitute for as of politicians and office holders representing their constituents or of a tenant representing other tenants in a housing dispute. <i>Santos are small wooden figures representing saints.</i>
shibboleth	A custom, principle, or belief distinguishing a particular class or group of people, especially a long-standing one regarded as outmoded or no longer important. <i>Liberal shibboleths about education.</i>

sign	Mark or consecrate with the sign of the cross. <i>A person born under the sign of Virgo.</i>
signal	Be a signal for or a symptom of. <i>The diner signaled the waiters to bring the menu.</i>
<u>signature</u>	A sheet with several pages printed on it it folds to page size and is bound with other signatures to form a book. <i>The chef produced the p t that was his signature.</i>
slogan	A motto associated with a political party or movement or other group. <i>Students were chanting slogans.</i>
<u>symbol</u>	Symbolize. <i>The limousine was another symbol of his wealth and authority.</i>
