- *A series of extracts from a film or broadcast, used for advance publicity.*
- *The rear section of an articulated lorry.*
- *A large transport conveyance designed to be pulled by a truck or tractor.*
- *A thing that trails, especially a trailing plant.*
- *A wheeled vehicle that can be pulled by a car or truck and is equipped for occupancy.*
- *An unpowered vehicle equipped for living in, typically used during holidays; a caravan.*
- *An open cart.*
- *Someone who takes more time than necessary; someone who lags behind.*
- *An advertisement consisting of short scenes from a motion picture that will appear in the near future.*

- A platform for transporting a boat.
- An unpowered vehicle towed by another.
- A mobile home.

- camper** A recreational vehicle equipped for camping out while traveling.
*The site offers washing facilities for **campers**.*
- caravanette** A motor vehicle with a rear compartment equipped for living in.
- climbing plant** An event that involves rising to a higher point (as in altitude or temperature or intensity etc).
- cutting** The action of cutting something.
*The **cutting** of the cake.*
- dawdler** Someone who takes more time than necessary; someone who lags behind.

drone	A musical instrument or part of one sounding a continuous note of low pitch in particular also drone pipe a pipe in a bagpipe or also drone string a string in an instrument such as a hurdy gurdy or a sitar. <i>The University takes all the profit and redistributes it to drones like him.</i>
excerpt	A short extract from a film, broadcast, or piece of music or writing. <i>She read out excerpts from an article in the Times.</i>
extract	A preparation containing the active ingredient of a substance in concentrated form. <i>An extract from a historical film.</i>
fragment	A piece broken off or cut off of something else. <i>Nathan remembered fragments of the conversation.</i>
house trailer	Aristocratic family line.
laggard	Someone who takes more time than necessary; someone who lags behind. <i>Staff were under enormous pressure and there was no time for laggards.</i>
lagger	Someone who takes more time than necessary; someone who lags behind.
mobile home	Sculpture suspended in midair whose delicately balanced parts can be set in motion by air currents.
poke	A bag made of paper or plastic for holding customer's purchases. <i>I expect you'd prefer something with a bit more poke.</i>
preview	A screening for a select audience in advance of release for the general public. <i>There was a small reception after the preview.</i>
prevue	An advertisement consisting of short scenes from a motion picture that will appear in the near future.
selection	A plot of land acquired by selection. <i>The restaurant offers a wide selection of hot and cold dishes.</i>
snippet	A small piece or brief extract. <i>Snippets of information about the war.</i>
trailing plant	Evidence pointing to a possible solution.

- *Forty lorry trailers loaded with fish.*
- *A farm trailer hauled by a tractor.*
- *Terrific trailers for mediocre movies.*



Trailer as a Verb

Definitions of "Trailer" as a verb

According to the [Oxford Dictionary of English](#), "trailer" as a verb can have the following definitions:

- *Give advance publicity to (a film, broadcast, or proposal) by releasing extracts or selected details.*
- *Transport (something) by trailer.*



Synonyms of "Trailer" as a verb (14 Words)

announce	Announce publicly or officially. <i>He announced his retirement from international football.</i>
bill	Send a bill to someone. <i>We were billed for 4 nights in the hotel although we stayed only 3 nights.</i>
broadcast	Broadcast over the airwaves as in radio or television. <i>Broadcast the news.</i>
call attention to	Order, request, or command to come.
give notice of	Bestow, especially officially.
give publicity to	Give or supply.
make known	Act in a certain way so as to acquire.
make public	Be suitable for.

post	Publicize with or as if with a poster. <i>I ll post an article next week revealing the results of the poll.</i>
proclaim	Announce officially or publicly. <i>His high intelligent forehead proclaimed a strength of mind that was almost tangible.</i>
promulgate	Put a law into effect by formal declaration. <i>These objectives have to be promulgated within the organization.</i>
publicize	Make public. <i>Judy had started to publicize books and celebrities.</i>
shout from the rooftops	Utter a sudden loud cry.
trumpet	Proclaim on or as if on a trumpet. <i>Wild elephants trumpeting in the bush.</i>



Usage Examples of "Trailer" as a verb

- *The aircraft is easy to trailer and will fit into any garage.*
- *The series has already been heavily trailered.*
