Definitions of "Trainee" as a noun

According to the [Oxford Dictionary of English](#), “trainee” as a noun can have the following definitions:

- *Someone who is being trained.*
- *A person undergoing training for a particular job or profession.*



Synonyms of "Trainee" as a noun (7 Words)

- apprentice** A beginner.
*An **apprentice** barman.*
- learner** Works for an expert to learn a trade.
*A fast **learner**.*
- novice** An animal, especially a racehorse, that has not yet won a major prize or reached a sufficient level of performance to qualify for important events.
*The **novice** hurdles.*
- probationer** A person who is serving a probationary or trial period in a job or position to which they are newly appointed.
- pupil** A trainee barrister.
*They are former **pupils** of the school.*
- starter** A preparation of chemicals to initiate the breakdown of vegetable matter in making compost.
*Material to act as a **starter** for discussion.*
- student** A learned person (especially in the humanities); someone who by long study has gained mastery in one or more disciplines.
*A maths **student**.*

headmaster	Presiding officer of a school.

instructor	A person whose occupation is teaching. <i>A driving instructor.</i>
learner	A person who is learning to drive a motor vehicle and has not yet passed a driving test. <i>A fast learner.</i>
matriculate	A person who has matriculated. <i>A total of 123 boys and girls who matriculated last year were registered with his department.</i>
pedagogics	The principles and methods of instruction.
pedagogy	The principles and methods of instruction. <i>The relationship between applied linguistics and language pedagogy.</i>
polytechnic	A technical school offering instruction in many industrial arts and applied sciences.
prentice	Works for an expert to learn a trade. <i>My brother was prenticed to a wheelwright.</i>
pupil	A young person attending school (up through senior high school). <i>Will you take me on as your pupil.</i>
schooling	The training of a horse on the flat or over fences. <i>Schooling fences.</i>
schoolmaster	An experienced horse that is used to train or give confidence to inexperienced riders or horses.
student	A school pupil. <i>Student loans.</i>

studying	Reading carefully with intent to remember.
teach	A teacher. <i>He came one day each week to teach painting.</i>
teaching	The occupation, profession, or work of a teacher. <i>Good classroom teaching is seldom rewarded.</i>
training	The action of teaching a person or animal a particular skill or type of behaviour. <i>In service training for staff.</i>
tutorial	An account or explanation of a subject, printed or on a computer screen, intended for private study. <i>Online tutorials and reference guides.</i>
undergraduate	Denoting or relating to an undergraduate. <i>A group of Oxford undergraduates.</i>
<u>university</u>	The body of faculty and students at a university. <i>I went to university at the Sorbonne.</i>
